The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jefty's Order in Council of the Twelfth of February laft, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltflaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nuils, or Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into or mode wifeld as a Navel Store will converted into or made ufeful as a Naval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of August next: and whereas it is expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of his Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Twelfth Day of August next, prefume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Scas, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltfaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into or made ufeful as a Naval Store; or fhip or lade any of the Articles abovementioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to exporting the fame beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or his Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, Chap. 2. ; and alfo by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, Chap. 34, any Thing con-tained in His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth Day of June last to the contrary not-Wenty nich Day of June lait to the contrary, not-withflanding : and the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necef-fary Directions herein as to them may refpectively uppertain appertain,
