The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HIS Day the Right Honorable Philip Earl of Hardwicke, and the Right Honorable George Legge, commonly called Vifcount Lewifham, were; by His Majefty's Command, fworn of His Majefty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and took their Places at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleafed to declare the Right Honorable-Philip Earl of Hardwicke, Lieutenant-General and General-Governor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

His Majefty having been pleafed to appoint the Right Honorable Robert Lord Hobart to be One of His Majelty's Principal Secretaries of State, his Lordship was this Day, by His Majefty's Command, fworn One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.
