P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honorable Philip Earl of Hardwicke, and the Right Honorable George Legge, commonly called Viscount Lewisham, were, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and took their Places at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to declare the Right Honorable Philip Earl of Hardwicke, Lieutenant-General and General-Governor of that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honorable Robert Lord Hobart to be One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, his Lordship was this Day, by His Majesty's Command, sworn One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.
