*Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Duckworth, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at the Leeward Islands, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Martinique, 14th February 1801.*

S I R,

I Erewith you will receive a List of Captures and Detentions since the last Return, by His Majesty's Ship Hydra, in October 1800; and I have the Honor to be, &c. J. T. DUCKWORTH.

*List of Vessels captured and detained by His Majesty's Ships and Vessels under the Orders of Rear-Admiral Duckworth, Commander in Chief at the Leeward Islands, since the Return of December 1800.*

American Brig Apello, from Guadaloupe to Saint Bartholomew, in Ballast : Captured by the Southampton, December 2, 1800. Condemned at Guadaloupe without proper Papers; then purchased by the former Master, an American.

Swedish Brig Resolution, from Guadaloupe to Saint Bartholomew, laden with Produce : Captured by Ditto, December 2, 1800. Supposed to be French Property.

French Schooner, (Name unknown,) laden with Flour, Lumber, &c. : Captured off Guadaloupe by the Guachupin, December 16, 1800, and deserted by her Crew.

American Schooner Polly, from Baltimore to Saint Jago de Cuba, laden with Naval Stores : Detained by the Gipsy; Tender to the Leviathan, December 24, 1800. The Master, when hailed, said she was bound to Saint Bartholomew, but his Papers and Clearance were for Cuba.

French Schooner Hebe, from Saint Thomas's to Guadaloupe, laden with Flour, Gin, &c. : Captured by the Guachupin, December 26, 1800, Twelve Leagues to the Westward of Guadaloupe.

Hamburgh Ship Aurora, from Charkelown to Hamburgh, laden with Sugar, Cotton, and Indigo : Detained by the Gipsy Tender, December 27, 1800. Appeared on Evidence that she was bound to Bourdeaux, and that the Master had destroyed her Papers.

Dominica Schooner Fortune, from Dominica to Saint Rupert's Bay, laden with Provisions : Recaptured by the Daphne, December 24, 1800, having been in Possession of the Enemy.

Swedish Schooner Courtenay, from Point Petre to Saint Bartholomew, laden with Sugar, Coffee, and Cotton : Captured by the Gipsy Tender, January 5, 1801, having been chased by her until the upset off Saint Bartholomew.

English Sloop, (Name unknown,) from Guadaloupe to Point Petre, in Ballast : Recaptured by the
