WHEREAS Information has been received from Vice-Admiral Lord Viscount Nelson, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Baltic, that a Notification has been made to him by the Russian Government, that His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of all the Russias, has directed that the Embargo on British Vessels detained in the Ports of His Dominions should be taken off, and that the Crews thereof should be released: And whereas the Government of Denmark has lately manifested the most conciliatory Dispositions towards His Majesty, and has declared its Readiness to concur in any amicable Arrangements which might be agreed upon between His Majesty and the Emperor of all the Russias; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to order, That the Order made by His Majesty in Council on the Fourteenth of January last, directing that no Ships or Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects should be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of Russia, Denmark, or Sweden, be revoked and discharged, so far as relates to Ships and Vessels belonging to any of His Majesty's Subjects entering and clearing out for any of the Ports of Russia or Denmark:

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the general Embargo or Stop directed by His Majesty's Orders in Council of the same Date, to be made of all Russian, Danish, or Swedish Vessels then within any of the Ports, Harbours, or Roads of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or which should thereafter arrive in any of the said Ports, Harbours, or Roads, or in the Ports, Harbours, or Roads of any of the Forts and Settlements belonging to the Crown of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or of any of His Majesty's Colonies, Islands and Plantations, together with all Persons and Effects on board such Ships and Vessels; and also all other Orders made by His Majesty in Council touching the said Embargo or Stop upon the Ships and Vessels aforesaid, be in the like Manner revoked and discharged, so far as relates to the Ships and Vessels, Persons and Effects belonging to the Subjects of Russia or Denmark:

And His Majesty, with the Advice aforesaid, is also further pleased to order, that the Order made by His Majesty in Council on the 16th of the said Month of January, directing that no Bills drawn since the Twenty-ninth of November last, O. S. (corresponding with the Tenth of December, N. S.) by or on Behalf of Persons being Subjects, or residing in the Dominions of the Emperor of Russia, should be accepted or paid, without Licence from One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, or until further Signification of His Majesty's Pleasure, be, and the same is hereby revoked and discharged:

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Order made by His Majesty in Council on the Twenty-eighth of the said Month of January, forbidding the Payment of any Money or Bills due or payable to or on Behalf of any Person or Persons being Subjects of, or residing within the Dominions of the Emperor of Russia, or the Kings of Denmark or Sweden, or any of them, for the Freight of Merchandize imported in any Russian,



Swedish, or Danish Ship detained under the Embargo, be, and the same is hereby revoked and discharged, so far as relates to the Payment of any Money or Bills due or payable for Freight to the Subjects of Russia or Denmark.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS the Islands of Saint Martin and Saint Eustatius, in the West Indies, as well as the Dependencies, Territories, and Ports belonging to the same, have been surrendered to His Majesty's Arms, and the same are now in His Majesty's Possession; His Majesty is thereupon pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the said Islands of Saint Martin and Saint Eustatius, subject nevertheless to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, and Islands in the West Indies, is, or shall be subject by Law: And His Majesty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all Commodities being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the said Islands of Saint Martin and Saint Eustatius being in His Majesty's Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigable according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, or Islands in the West Indies: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Third Day of December last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder

or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of this instant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of this instant June, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Third Day of December last, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, will expire upon the Tenth Day of this instant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Tenth Day of this instant

June, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called *Lignum Vitæ*; without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have been concerned in advising or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same; for authorizing His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying Coastwise of Pot-Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for making further Provisions relative thereto:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board any of the said Wood called *Lignum Vitæ*, which may be necessary for the Use of the said Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the said Wood called *Lignum Vitæ* to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Ports and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies. Provided that, upon the Exportation of the said Wood called *Lignum Vitæ* to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Ports and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the said Wood called *Lignum Vitæ* do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Wood called *Lignum Vitæ* to the Places for which it is so entered Outwards, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Wood called *Lignum Vitæ* has been duly landed at the Places for which it was

entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *W.
