The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. TIS Majesty, in Council, was this Day pleased to declare His Grace William Henry Cavendish Duke of Portland Lord President of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and his Grace took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majefty having been pleafed to appoint the Right Honorable Thomas Lord Pelham to be one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, his Lordfhip was, this Day, by His Majefty's Command, fworn One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

It is this Day ordered by His Majefty in Council, that the Parliament which flands prorogued to Thurfday the Sixth Day of August next be further prorogued to Tuefday the Fifteenth Day of September next.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Eleventh of February laft, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltflaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or of Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into, or made useful as a Naval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of August next; and whereas it is expedient for His Majerty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition flould be, in Part, continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever, do at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to Store, or of Copper capable of being converted,

commence from the faid Twelfth Day of August next, prefume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or any Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, or fhip, or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to exporting the fame beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, Cap. 2. and also by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 34: But it is His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to the Exportation of any of the aforefaid Articles from Great Britain to Ireland, or from Ireland to Great Britain, respectively, or to any Exportation of any of the faid Articles, by, or on board of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships, or Veffels, or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majelty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the courfe of her intended Voyage, or to any Exportation thereof by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or from the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, or from the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to His Majefty's Yards and Garrifons within the Limits of Europe, nor to the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, provided that in cafe of the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Life mits of Europe, either of Copper being a Navat

into a Naval Store, the Exporters thereof, do first | make Oath of the true Destination of the said-Articles to the Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, for which the fame shall respectively be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cultoms in Great Britain, or to the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland, as the Cafe may be, to carry the faid Articles to the Port or Place, without the Limits of Europe, for which the fame shall respectively be entered outwards, and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland, as the Cafe may be, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners respectively, and specified in fuch Bond of a Certificate or Certificates in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners respectively, as the Cafe may be, thereby shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the "Port or Place without the Limits of Europe for which they were refpectively entered outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majelty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may re-Steph: Cottrell. fpectively appertain.

The King has also been pleated to grant unto Thomas Lambert, of Burrow-Hall, in the Parish of Tunstall, in the County of Lancaster, Esq; (only furviving Son and Heir of Robert Lambert, deceased, who was the Nephew, ex parte maternâ, of Robert Fenwick and Nicholas Fenwick, both late of Burrow-Hall aforefaid, Efqrs. deceafed,) His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Iffue may take and ufe the Surname, and bear the Arms of Fenwick only, in Compliance with the Directions contained in the last Wills and Tefta-ments of the faid Robert Fenwick and Nicholas Fenwick, Efqrs. ; fuch Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds'-Office :

Copy of a Letter from Rear Admiral Sir Jumes Saumarez, to Evan Nepean, Efq; dated on board His Majefty's Ship Cafar, at Gibraltar, the 6th July 1801. SIR.

Have to request you will be presented in the Admiralty, that, my Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, that, Have to request you will be pleased to inform . conformably to my Letter of Yefterday's Date, I flood through the Streights, with His Majefty's Squadron under my Orders, with the Intention of attacking Three French Line of Battle Ships and a Frigate, that I had received Information of being at Anchor off Algeziras; on opening Cabareta Point, I found the Ships lay at a confiderable Diftance from the Enemy's Batteries, and having a leading Wind up to them, afforded every reafonable Hope of Succefs in the Attack.

I had previoufly directed Captain Hood, in the Venerable, from his Experience and Knowledge of the Anchorage, to lead the Squadron, which he executed with his accustomed Gallantry, and although it was not intended he fhould anchor, he found himfelf under the Neceflity fo to do, from the Wind's failing, (a Circumfance fo much to be apprehended in this Country,) and to which Cir-cumfance I have to regret the Want of Success in this well-intended Enterprife; Captain Stirling an-chored opposite to the inner Ship of the Enemy, and brought the Pompée to Action in the most fpirited and gallant Manner, which was also followed by the Commanders of every Ship in the Squadron.

Captains Darby and Ferris, owing to light Winds, were prevented for a confiderable Time from coming into Action; at length the Hannibal getting a Breeze, Captain Ferris had the most favorable Prospect of being alongfide one of the Enemy's Ships, when the Hannibal unfortunately took the Ground, and I am extremely concerned to acquaint their Lordihips, that after having made every poffible Effort with this Ship and the Audacious, to cover her from the Enemy, I was under the Neceffity to make Sail, being at the Time only Three Cables' Length from one of the Enemy's Batteries.

My Thanks are particularly due to all the Cap-tains, Officers, and Men under my Orders; and although their Endeavours have not been crowned with Succefs, I truft the Thoufands of Spectators from His Majefly's Garrison, and also the furrounding Coaft, will do Juffice to their Valour and Intrepidity, which was not to be checked by the Fire from the numerous Batteries, however formidable, that furround Algeziras.

I feel it incumbent upon me to flate to their Lordships the great Merits of Captain Brenton, of the

Cafar, whole cool Judgment and intrepid Conduct, | A Lift of the Killed and Wounded on board His Ma-I will venture to pronounce, were never furpaffed. I also beg Leave to recommend to their Lordships' Notice my Flag-Lieutenant .Mr. Philip Dumarefq, who has ferved with me from the Commencement of this War, and is a most deferving Officer. Mr. Lamborne and the other Lieutenants are also entitled to great Praife, as well as Captain Maxwell of the Marines, and the Officers of his Corps ferving on board the Cæfar.

The Enemy's Ships confifted of Two of Eightyfour Guns, and One of Seventy-four, with a large Frigate; Two of the former are aground, and-the Whole are rendered totally unferviceable.

I cannot clofe this Letter without rendering the most ample Justice to the great Bravery of Captain Ferris: the Lofs in his Ship must have been very confiderable both in Officers and Men; but I have the Satisfaction to be informed, that His Majefty. has not loft fo valuable an Officer.

SIR,

Herewith enclose the Copy of a Letter from Captain Ferris, of His Majesty's late Ship Hannibal, which I request you will pleafe to lay before their Lordships; and I have only to express my deep Regret that his well-meant Endeavours to bring his Ship to clofe Action fhould have occasioned fo fevere a Lofs. J. SAUMAREZ.

SIR, Algeziras, July 7, 1801. Have little more to tell you of the Fate of His Have little more to ten you of the Majefty's Ship Hannibal than yourfelf must have observed, only, that from the Number of Batteries and Ships, Gun-Boats, &c. we had to encounter, our Guns foon got knocked up; and I found it was impoffible to do any Thing either for the Pre-fervation of the Ship or for the Good of the Ser-vice, our Boats, Sails, Rigging, and Springs being all fhot away; and having fo many Killed and Wounded, which will appear by the annexed Lift, I thought it prudent to ftrike, and thereby preferve the Lives of the brave Men that remained.

Had I been fuccessful in the View before me, previous to the Ship's taking the Ground, my Prailes of the Conduct of my Officers and Ship's Cömpany could not have exceeded their Merits; but I have, notwithftanding, the Satisfaction to fay, that every Order was observed and carried into Execution with that Promptitude and Alacrity becoming British Officers and Scamen.

TO OFFICERS ON HALF-PAY.

War-Office, August 1, 1801. A LL Officers on the Half-Pay of the Land Forces, refident in Great Britain and Ireland, who are not ferving in the Militia, or who do not hold Offices under Government, are hereby re-quired immediately to transmit to the General Officers commanding in the Diffricts within which they refpectively refide, an Account, in Writing, of their Age, past Services, and prefent Place of Abode, in order that their Services may be called for as Circumstances shall render it expedient : And fuch as think themfelves, from Age or Infirmities, unfit for further Service even in this Country, are to accompany their Reports with fufficient Vouchers of their Inability, and the Caufes thereof. Such Officers on Half-Pay as are ferving in the

Militia, or are otherwife employed under Government, (Officers of the Yeomanry and Volunteer Corps excepted, whole Reports are to be made to the Generals commanding in Diffricts as above mentioned,) are to transmit limilar Accounts to the Secretary at War, fpecifying also the Nature of the Public Situations which they posses.

The General Officers commanding in Diftricts will make Returns to the Secretary at War of the Names of the Officers who fliall report themfelves in purfuance of the above Notice. And every Officer who shall neglect to make his Report, either to the Commander of a District or to the Secretary at War, according to the Circumstances of his Situation, within One Month from the Date hereof, will be confidered as otherwife provided for, or dead, and his Name will be ftruck off the Half-Pay Lift accordingly.
