## MEMORANDUM.

Lieutenant Michael Redmond, of Colonel Mac-'Neill's Regiment of Fencible Infantry, who was fuperfeded in the Gazette of the 18th of July lath, is rejustated in his Rank.

Admiralty Office, August 25, 1801.

Copy of a Letter from Lord Viscount Nelfon, K. B. Vice-Admiral of the Blue, Sc. to Evan Nepean, Ejq; dated Downs, the 23d Inflant. SIR,

HErewith 1 transmit you a Letter which I have received from Captain Rose, giving me an Account of the Boats of the feveral Veffels under his Orders having burnt a Quantity of Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, destroyed Three Gun Boats, taken Two Launches, and a Flat Boat about Fortyfive Feet long, and Eighteen or Twenty Feet Wide, mounted with One Brafs Eight Inch Howitzer; this Boat funk aftern of the Hound. The Businefs on the Part of our Boats was conducted with much Spirit; and much 'Praife is due to Lieutenant Agaffiz, of the Hound, and Lieutenant L. Vescont, of the Jamaica, for their brave Example on this Occafion.

MY LORD, August 21, 1801. Jugg Leave to acquaint you, that Yefterday Even-ing, at Eight o'Clock, being at Anchor off Eftaples, I observed a large Fire to the S. S. E., and at the fame Time a very heavy Cannonade. I immediately got under Weigh with the Veffels under my Orders, and ran-down to it. About Ten I fpoke Captain Sanadine, of the Hound, who informed me that the Fire proceeded from a Cargo of Pitch and Tar, belonging to a Veffel wrecked on the Coaft fome Time ago, which the Boats of the Hound and Mallard had fet Fire to; and that Six Elat Boats had come out of Saint Vallery that Afternoon, which he forced on Shore, and then lay hauled upon the Beach.

Laccordingly this Morning fent the Boats of the Jamaica, Gannet, and Hound, together with those of the Gun-Brigs, and endeavour to cut them out, under the Direction of Lieutenant James Agaffiz, of the Hound; at the fame Time flanding in with the different Veffels, in order to cover the Boats from the Eire of the Military and Five Field Pieces, pofted behind the Sand Hills on Shore.

I am happy to acquaint your Lordship that they fucceeded in bringing off Three; the others had been previously fouttled, fo as to render it impossible to remove them; however the Boats damaged them as much as the Time would admit of.
