To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Noblemen, Gentlemen, Freeholders, Justices of Peace, and Commissioners of Supply of the County of Ayr.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, convened for the Purpose by special Advertisement, humbly beg Leave to approach your Royal Person with our Congratulations on having attained the Blessings of Peace. We acknowledge your Majesty's paternal Goodness and Wisdom, in having put a Period to a long and eventful War; a War however, which, while it lasted, carried the Naval and Military Glory of this Country to a Pitch almost unrivalled, and that in Climates hitherto unknown to the Range of British Arms. We hope that the Attainment of these Blessings will not lull us into a treacherous Security, but what we have obtained by our Moderation, by our Vigilance we shall preserve. That the Blessings we have been enabled to attain, Providence will render permanent. That we shall now cultivate the Arts of Peace with as much Assiduity as we shewed Fortitude in sustaining the Toils of War. That Harmony and Union may prevail in your Kingdom; and Prosperity within your Palace. And we pray that Providence may long preserve a Life endeared to the Nation by every Virtue, that it may sweeten it with every Comfort, and that neither foreign Wars, nor political Commotions, nor domestic Tumults may disturb the Remainder of your Reign.

*Whereas it has been humbly represented to His Majesty, that on Saturday the 19th Instant, about Half-past Two o'Clock in the Morning, Mr. Archibald Weatherston, Coast Waiter, in the Service of the Customs, at Budle, within the Port of Berwick, being out upon Duty, and attempting to examine a Cart which he met upon the Road leading from Sunderland to the Wye, was at a Place called Newham-How-Ways, most barbarously and inhumanly beaten by Three Men, one of whom was on Horseback, and the other Two in the Cart, who seized him and knocked him down with Bludgeons, and afterwards tied his Hands behind his Back, and his Legs together, and then left him bleeding, and almost senseless in consequence of the Wounds which he had received. From the Conversation which passed between them there is Reason to believe that the said Three Men were Smugglers belonging to Boomer, and one of them said, in Answer to the Complaints of the said Archibald Weatherston, that he had himself been worse used by an Excise Officer;*

*His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of the said Offenders who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices, so that any One or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence.*
