PRINCE OF WALES'S COUNCIL.

County of Cornwall.

AT a Council of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, held at Carlzon-House the 1st Day of February 1803, Thomas Rawlings, of Paditlow, Esq. was appointed Sheriff of the County of Cornwall for the Year 1803 by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales in Council,

St. James's February 2, 1803.

This Day Baron Silverhjelm, Minister Resident from the King of Sweden, had a private Audience of His Majesty, in which he delivered New Credentials, giving him the Character of Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from Sweden :

To which he was introduced by the Right Honorable Lord Hawkesbury, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Stephen Cottrell, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

St. James's, February 2, 1803.

The King was this Day pleased to confer the Honor of Knighthood on Major Charles Holloway of the Royal Engineers.

Downing-Street, February 5, 1803.

The King has been pleased to appoint Colonel Thomas Hillop to be Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Grenada and its Dependencies.

Whitehall, February 5, 1803.

The King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Bristol to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the Translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Folliot Herbert Walker, late Bishop thereof, to the See of Hereford : And His Majesty has also been pleased to recommend the Honorable and Reverend George Pelham, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Bristol.

Whitehall, February 2, 1803.

The King has been graciously pleased to grant unto Peregrine Langton, of Langton, in the County of Lincoln, Esq; and Elizabeth Mary-Anne his Wife, only Daughter and Heir of Henry Maffingberd, late of Braytoft-Hall, now Gunby, in the said County, Esq; deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority, that they, and the Issue of their Marriage, may assume the Surname only, and bear the Arms, of Maffingberd, with due Distinctions, in Com-

pliance with the Conditions contained in the last Will and Testament of the said Henry Maffingberd ; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office :

And also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
