Copy of a Letter from Commodore Hood, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels in the Leeward Islands, to Sir Evan Nepean, Bart. dated on board His Majesty's Ship Centaur, off Guadeloupe, the 6th November 1803.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honor to enclose, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Copy of a Letter I received from Captain Graves, of His Majesty's Ship Blenheim, giving an Account of the Capture of a Privateer by the Boats of that Ship, in Fort Royal Bay, Martinique.

The Capture of Two more of the Enemy's Privateers is set forth in a Letter from Captain Young-husband, of the Osprey. The brave and handsome Conduct of Lieutenant Henderson, and those in the
