AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 4th of *January* 1804,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-second Day of June One thousand eight hundred and three, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of this instant January: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the said Eleventh Day of this instant January, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores,

or Ship or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:"

But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the

Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards; And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

the former being reinforced by Lieutenant Payne
and some of the *Immortalité*'s Men,) had captured
One of the Enemy's Gun-Vessels, a Dogger, a
Schuyt, and Two Blankenberg Fishing-Boats, ap-
parently Part of a Convoy proceeding to Boulogne.

HAVING last Night reinforced the Crew of the
Archer with some Men from this Ship, and
pushed her in close Shore, she was fortunate enough
to fall in with and capture the French Lugger Gun-
Vessel, No. 432, mounting an Eighteen and a
Twelve-Pounder, commanded by an Ensign de Vaif-
seau, with Five Seamen, a Lieutenant, and Twenty-
six Grenadiers of the Thirty-sixth Regiment of the
Line, some of whom, with Two Seamen, escaped
in her Boat during the running Fight, which she
continued for a Quarter of an Hour with her Stern
Gun and Musketry. The *Archer* had Part of her
Rigging cut, but no one materially hurt on either
Side.

The *Archer* and Griffin afterwards captured a
Dogger, a Schuyt, and Two Blankenberg Fishing-
Boats, which the Prisoners report to be Part of a
Convoy, which, with a Prame of Sixteen Guns, and
Five or Six Gun-Vessels escaped under the Land in
the dark; some, I understand, laden with Pro-
visions and Stores. The Schuyt has Gun, and the
Fishing Boats Timbers and Knees for Boats; each
Vessel had Three or Four Soldiers on board.

Lieutenant Sheriff, of the *Archer*, has done every
Thing I could possibly wish or expect from his Zeal;
and Lieutenant Payne, of this Ship, who commanded
the Boat and Party assisting the *Archer*, executed

that Service with his usual Alacrity, and the Com-
mander of the Griffin has my Thanks for the Share
he bore in bringing off the latter Vessels, which was
effected under a very heavy Fire from the Shore, to
which they wore as close as possible.

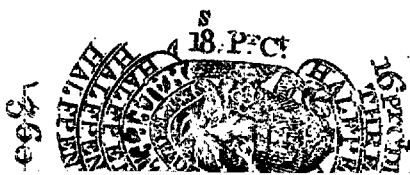

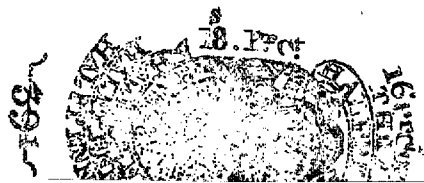
