Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Veffel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of

Our Will is, therefore, and We charge, that this the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Veffel with any of the Articles above mentioned, the faid Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the fame Duties of Customs and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ships or Veffel .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions accordingly.
