HEREAS the Colony of Surinam, in South America, has been furrendered to His Majefty's Arms, and the Territory and Forts of the same are delivered up to His Majesty, and the said Colony is now in His Majesty's Possession; His Majesty is thereupon pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the Taid Colony of Surinam, Subject, nevertheless, to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, Restrictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, and Islands in the West Indies, is or shall be subject by Law: And His Majesty is further pleafed to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all Commodities, being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the faid Colony of Surinam, being in His Majesty's

Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of this Kingdom in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forseitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, or Islands in the West Indies: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Eleventh Day of May One thousand eight hundred and three, and by subsequent Orders continuing the said former Order from Time to Time, to order, require, prohibit, and command that no Person or Persons whatfoever should at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the Date of the faid Order, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles before-mentioned, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same to any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council: (except for the Purpoles and to the Places mentioned in the faid Order:) And whereas it hath been represented on Behalf of the principal Importers and Venders of Bar-Iron in the City of London, that great

Lols and Inconvenience will refult to the Trade by the Exportation of Bar Iron continuing to be prohibited to Countries in Amity with His Majesty, without special Orders being obtained for that Purpole; His Majesty taking the same into Consideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, (as it is hereby ordered,) that, from and after the Date hereof, the Exportation of Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron shall, notwithstanding the faid Orders, be permitted and allowed from any of the Ports of this Kingdom to any Country in or out of Europe, in Amity with His Majesty, in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; provided the Merchant Exporter of any fuch Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which such Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron shall be entered Outwards before, the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security by Bond to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs to carry the faid Bar-Iron and Pig Iron to the Flaces for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other, and to produce within Twelve Months from the Date of the Bond, from the British Consul or Vice-Consul resident at the Part for which such Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron shall be cleared out, or in case there shall be no Conful there resident, or he shall be absent from the same, then from Two British Merchants, relident there, a Certificate or Certificates that fuch Bar-Iron and Pig-Iron has been duly delivered at the Ports for which the same was cleared out, and the Bonds or Securities shall not be cancelled or delivered up but on Production of such Certificate or Certificates; and the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Direc-W.
