AT the Court at Weymouth, the 20th of September 1804,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS, in virtue of the Powers vested VV in His Majesty by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act" for permitting, until the Fifth Day of May One " thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation of Hides, Calf-Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in Foreign Ships, on Pay-" ment of the like Duties, as if imported in British " or Irish Ships;" His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Nineteenth Day of July last, to permit, for the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Twenty-third Day of the said Month of July, the Importation in Foreign Ships of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dressed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dressed or undressed, Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), on the Duties specified in the said Order; And whereas it is judged expedient that the said Permission should be continued for some Time longer, His Majelly is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for and during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the Twenty-third Day of October next, the Importation of any Hides, Pieces of Hides, dreffed or undressed, Calf-Skins, or Pieces of Calf-Skins, dreffed or undreffed. Horns, or Pieces of Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in any Foreign Ship or Veffel; and that on the Arrival at any Port of the United Kingdom of any Foreign Ship or Vessel with any of the Atticles above mentioned, the said Goods shall be admitted to Entry on Payment of the same Duties of Customs and Excife as are due and payable on the like Goods when imported in any British or Irish-built Ship or Vessel.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

Copy of a Letter from the Right Honorable I.ord Keith. K. B. Admiral of the Blue, &c. to William Marsden, Esq; duted on board His Majesty's Ship the Monarch, off Boulogne, the 3d Instant. SIR.

THEIR Lordships are aware that my Attention has, for some Time past, been directed to the Object of ascertaining the most effectual Mode for annoying the Enemy's Flotillas at their Anchorages in Front of their Ports, under Protection of their Land Batteries.

Having, on the Afternoon of the 1st Instant, arrived at this Anchorage, and finding the Weather promising to be favourable, and about One Hundred and Fifty of the Flotilla on the Outside of the Pier, I resolved to make an Experiment, on a limited Scale, of the Means of Attack which had been provided.

The final Arrangements for this Purpose were made on the Morning of Yesterday. The Officers named below\* were put in Charge of the principal Vessels which at this Time were to be used. The Armed Launches, and other Boats of the Squadron, were appointed to accompany and protect them. The Castor, Greyhound, and some smaller Vessels were directed to take up an advanced and convenient Anchorage for covering the Retreat, giving Protection to Men who might be wounded, and Boats that might be crippled, and for towing off the Boats in general, in the Event of the Windfreshening and blowing upon the Coast.

Captains Winthrop, of the Ardent, and Owen, of the Immortalité, most zealously and usefully superintended the Operations from the Southward, and the Honorable Captain Blackwood, of the Euryalus, from the Northward. KEITH.

The Operation commenced at a Quarter past 1 Nine o'Clock last Evening, and terminated at a Quarter past Four this Morning, during which Time several Vessels, prepared for the Purpose, were exploded amongst, or very close to the Flotilla; but on account of the very great Distance at which they lay from each other, no very extensive Injury seems to have been sustained, although it is evident that there has been very confiderable Confusion among them, and that two of the Brigs and feveral of the smaller Vessels appear to be missing since Yesterday at the Close of Day. I have great Satisfaction in reporting, that, notwithstanding a very heavy Discharge of Shells, Shot, and Musketry was kept up by the Enemy throughout the Night, no Calualty what-ever, on our Part, has been fustained. The Enemy made no Attempt to oppose their rowing Boats

Their Lordships will not expect that, at the prefent Moment, I am to enter much into Detail; but I think it my Duty to flate to them my Conviction that, in the Event of any great Accumulation of the Enemy's Force in their Roadsteads, an extensive and combined Operation of a fimilar Nature will hold forth a reasonable Prospect of a successful

The Conduct of the Officers and Men, who have been employed on this Occasion, deserves my highest Commendation: I cannot more forcibly impress their Merits upon their Lordships' Attention, than by remarking, that the Service was undertaken, not only in the Face of, but immediately under, the whole Line of the Enemy's Land Batteries, and their Field Artillery and Musquetry upon the Coast, but also under that of upwards of One Hundred and Fifty armed Veffels, ranged round the inner Side of the Bay; and that the Officers and Men who could To deliberately and resolutely advance into the Midst of the Florilla, under such Circumstances, must be considered worthy of being entrusted with the Performance of any Service, however difficult or dangerous it may appear to be, and consequently to be highly deferving of their Lordships' Protection.

HEREWITH I transmit you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Copy of a Letter from Captain Donnelly, of His Majetty's Ship Narciffus, with Copy of one to him from Lieutenant Thompson, of the faid Ship, detailing the Dellruction of several of the Enemy's Coalling Veffels; the Importance of this Service may be but little, but the determined Bravery of Lieutenants Thompson, Parker, Lumbey, and Moore, and the Petty Officers, Seamen, and Marines employed under them could not be exceeded. I am concerned to observe that Lieutenant Lumley has been obliged to fuffer Amputation at the Shoulder Joint, but I have much Pleasure in laying, that this. fine young Man is fast recovering; his Sufferings, I am fure, will meet their Lordships? Consideration.

His Majesty's Ship Narcissus, MY LORD, Hieres Bay, July 11, 1804. AST Night we attacked about a Dozen of the · Enemy's Vessels at La Vandour, in this Bay, with the Boats of the Narciffus, Seahorfe, and Maidstone, commanded by Lieutenants Hyde Parker. J. R. Lumley, and Ogle Moore, the whole under the Orders of Mr. John Thompson, First Lieutenant of this Ship, who, with his gallant Companions, boarded and destroyed almost the whole, under a prodigious and incessant Fire of Great Guns and Mulquetry, as well from the Vessels as from a Battery and the Clouses of the Town, close to which they were hauled in and well fecured.

I refer your Lordship to the inclosed Letter from Lieut Thompson for an Account of that Affair; and I beg to add, that it is impossible for me to express the Praise due to that intropid Officer and the Men, as well as Officers of every Description under his Command, whose Conduct I viewed with Admira-Herewith I also transmit a List of the Killed and Wounded, which I am extremely grieved to fay amounts to Twenty-feven

His Majefly's Ship Narciffus, SIR, Hieres Bay, July 11, 1804. BEG Leave to report the Proceedings of the Detachment of Boats you did me the Honor to that I Yesterday sell in with and captured La place under my Command last Night, whose Con-Conception French Privateer, mounting Two Brass duct and Gallantry I cannot sufficiently praise.

The Attack commenced at Midnight, under a tremendous Fire of Grape Shot and Mulketry; notwithstanding which we succeeded in boarding and firing most of the Enemy's Vessels, consisting of Eleven or Twelve Settees, chiefly laden. The Enemy were fully prepared, and had taken every Precaution to fecure them, they being moored Head and Stern, with their Bars on the Beach, and completely propt together under Water; we however towed one out in spite of their heavy and incessant Fire.

This Service, I am forry to fay, has cost us fe-veral valuable Lives. Among the Killed I have to regret the Loss of that very promising young Man W. Roche, Midshipman of this Ship, who was shot in firing of the Vessels: and Lieutenant Lumley, Messrs. Bedingsield, Watt, Victor, and Mansell, Midshipmen on board, wounded; I fear the former mortally; together with several Seamen and Marines

To Lieutenants Lumley and Moore of the Seahorse and Maidstone I feel greatly indebted for the steady and well-directed Fire kept up from the Launches of those Ships under their Command; also to Lieutenant Parker of this Ship, for his very able Support in boarding and deflioying the Enemy's Vessels. Indeed my warmest Thanks are due to every Officer, Petty Officer, Seaman and Marine employed on this Occasion.
