LONDON DOCKS.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MA-JESTY'S TREASURY.

Hereas by an Act paffed in the Fortieth VV Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefly, intituled "An Act for making Wet Docks, Balons, " Cuts, and other Works for the greater Accom-" modation and Security of Shipping, Commerce, " and Revenue, within the Port of London :" It is enacted, That from and after Notice of the Completion of the faid Docks should be given by public Advertisement in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers usually circulated in London, there should be payable and paid to the faid Company, or to their Collectors or Depaties for their Ufe for every Ship or Veffel entering into the faid Docks, the feveral Rates or Duties therein mentioned : And whereas by another Act paffed in the Forty-third Year of His faid present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for " permitting certain Goods imported into Great " Britain, to be fecured in Warehouse without pay-" ment of Duty :" It is enacted, That it should be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes enumerated or deferibed in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (B), and which fhould be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and fecure the fame under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the London Dock Company, in any Warehoufe or Warehoufes crefted or to be crefted, fituated within the Premifes belonging to the London Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Cultoms or Excife due on the Importation thereof, fubject neverthlefs to the Rules, Regulations, and Refrictions therein contained; provided that no fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize should be fo lodged, or fecured, unless and until fuch Warehoufes and other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, should be fo far compleated that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Freasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the fame should be fit and proper, in every Respect, for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame might, refpectively be fafely and fecurely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions in the faid Act contained; and the faid Lord High Trea-furer, or Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, were thereby authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand, or Hands, to centify

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
