A PROCLAMATION,

For apprehending George Rutherford, late Lieutenant of His Majesty's Ship Trident.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS a Warrant has been issued under the Hands of Six of Our Privy Council for apprehending Lieutenant George Rutherford, formerly acting Captain of Our Ship Trident, suspected of feloniously, wilfully, and with Malice aforethought, murdering John Smith, Charet Dause, and John Nichols, Mariners, belonging to Our said Ship, in the Month of March One thousand eight hundred and one, at Butcher Island, near Bombay, in the East Indies: And whereas it hath been represented unto Us, that the said George Rutherford did, on the Twelfth Day of the Month of March now last past, effect his Escape from on board Our Flag Ship at Plymouth, and is fled from Justice, We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects whomsoever, to discover and apprehend, and cause the said George Rutherford (who is about Forty Years of Age, is upwards of Five Feet Ten Inches high, of a dark swarthy Complexion, slender Person, but well made, and of a long thin Face, with dark Eyebrows and Black Eyes) to be discovered and apprehended, and to convey him before some of Our Justices of the Peace, or the Chief Magistrate of the County, City, Town, or Place where he shall be apprehended, who are respectively required to secure him, and thereof to give speedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End that the said George Rutherford may be forthcoming, and be proceeded against according to Law; and whoever shall discover the said George Rutherford, and bring him before such Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, shall receive for Reward the Sum of THREE HUNDRED POUNDS; which said Sum of Three Hundred Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required to pay accordingly.

Given at Our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Fifth Day of April, One thousand eight hundred and six, in the Forty-sixth Year of Our Reign.

Copy of a Letter from Captain John Davie, late Commander of His Majesty's Sloop Favourite, to William Marsden, Esq; dated on board the Trio Cartel, Falmouth, April 8, 1806.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honor to inclose a Copy of my Letter to Captain Maxwell, of His Majesty's Ship Arab, giving an Account of the Capture of a French Privateer by His Majesty's late Sloop the Favourite, under my Command.

His Majesty's Sloop Favourite, off the Tris Pongas, Dec. 28, 1805.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that, in Obedience to your Orders of the 18th Instant, I proceeded in His Majesty's Sloop under my Command to the Islands des Lofs, where I was informed that the Privateer you sent me in Pursuit of was at Anchor in the River of Pongas. I immediately shaped a Course for that Place; and, when within a few Leagues of it, Two Sail were discovered; which Mr. Wilson (who volunteered to be our Pilot) affirmed were Vessels which had been captured by her. Conceiving it to be my Duty, I instantly made all Sail, and gave chase to them. Owing to the Shallowness of the Water, and Incorrectness of the Charts, we did not reach the Entrance of the River till this Afternoon, when we discovered the Privateer under Sail, and working out. She allowed us to approach within half Gun-shot, when she attempted to get away. I immediately commenced a Fire from the Bow Guns, which soon induced her to shorten Sail, and, to my Surprise, haul athwart, and rake us. I did not choose to alter the Ship's Course, because it would have prevented my getting so near as I intended; but, when within our own Length, I luffed up, and gave her our Broadside. The Captain had the Temerity to continue engaging us for Twenty Minutes, which cost him and Ten others their Lives, and Twenty-five Men badly wounded; whilst I am happy to say, that Lieutenant Odumi, of the Royal African Corps, (a Passenger,) is the only Person hurt on board of us, and he is slightly

wounded. On taking Possession she proved to be Le General Blanchard Privateer, mounting Sixteen Guns, and manned with One Hundred and Thirty French and Spaniards.

I cannot do sufficient Justice to the Zeal and Perseverance displayed by Lieutenants Parsons and Ingram, Mr. Soady, the Master, as well as all the other Officers, Seamen, and Marines under my Command, in a tedious Chace of Three Days, obliged, principally, to sweep and tow the Ship, where we had never more than Three Fathoms Water; and regret very sincerely that their Bravery and good Conduct was not directed against a Vessel of greater Force.

Royal College of Physicians, March 31, 1806.

THE Censors of the Royal College of Physicians appointed for the present Year are about to commence their Annual Visitation of the Shops of the Apothecaries, Druggists, and Chymists within their Jurisdiction.

They are fully sensible of the Importance of the Duty to be performed by them, and are determined (as far as in their Power,) to correct the several Abuses so much complained of by their Predecessors in Office.

Their Attention will be chiefly directed to the following Objects:

1st, That the Scales, Weights, Measures, and other Utensils of the Shops be perfect and complete, and that they be of such Materials as are recommended by the College.

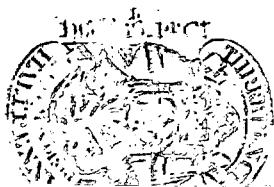
2dly, That a Copy of the Latin Edition of the London Pharmacopœia be in each Shop, and that the new Nomenclature be in general Use.

3dly, That their Drugs, both simple and compounded be of sufficient Variety, of good Quality, and in a proper State of Preservation.

4thly, That in the Absence of the Master, the Shop be under the Care of a Person or Persons well informed in the compounding of Medicines, and who can read the Pharmacopœia, and the Prescriptions of Physicians.

The Censors are likewise determined to give a proper Degree of Publicity to their Reports, that such Shops as are approved of be distinguished from those that are defective either from bad Drugs, or from ignorant and negligent Management.

They think proper to give this previous Notice to Apothecaries, Druggists, and Chymists, that they may have



a sufficient Impression of the serious Consequences they will be subjected to from a Neglect of those Objects now pointed out to them as so essential to the public Health.
