A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 21ft of May 1806,

PRESENT,

'The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty first Day of November laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majéfty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of June next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majelty's Reign, intituled " An ".Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the " Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the "Law for empowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and alfo to empower " His Majelty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of " Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or

" Ammunition :"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefly's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majefly's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. A T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 14th of May 1806,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS during the Interval which has elapfed fince His Majefty found himfelf.compelled, by the hoftile Meafures of His Majefty the King of Pruffia, to lay an Embargo on the Ships and Goods belonging to His Subjects, and to Places under His Controul, fuch hoftile Meafures have not been difcontinued: And whereas the Town of Papenburgh cannot but be confidered as dependent on, and under the abfolute Controul of Pruffia; His Majefty therefore is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprifals be granted againft the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the King of Pruffia, and of the Town of Papenburgh, (fave and except any Ships to which His Majefty's Licence has been granted, or which have been directed to be releafed from the Embargo,) fo that as well His Majefty's Fleets and Ships, as alfo all other Ships and Veffels that thall be commiffionated by Letters of Marque or General Reprifals, or otherwife, by His Majefty's Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, thall and may lawfully feize all Ships, Veffels, and Goods belonging to the King of Pruffia, or His Subjects, or others inhabiting within the Territories of the King of Pruffia, or belonging to the Town of Papenburgh, (except as aforefaid,) and bring the fame to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majefty's Dominions; and to that

End, His Majelty's Advocate-General, with the [Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Commillion, and present the fame to His Majefty at this Board, authoriting the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Perfon or Perfons by them empowered and appointed to iffue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprifals to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others, whom the faid Commiffioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing, and taking the Ships, Veffels, and Goods belonging to Prufia, and the Vaffals and Subjects of the King of Pruffia, or any inhabiting within His Countries, Territories, or Dominions, or belonging to the Town of Papenburgh (except as aforefaid); and that fuch Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Com-miflion as have been ufual, and are according to former Precedents; and His Majefty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are alfo forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Commillion, and prefent the fame to His Majelty at this Board, authorifing the faid Committioners for executing , the Office of Lord High Admiral, to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Bristain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, His Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the feveral Courts of Admiralty within His Ma-jelty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprifals of all Ships and Goods that are, or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the fame, and according to the Court of Admiralty and the Laws of Nations to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Goods as shall belong to Pruffia, or the Vaffals and Subjects of the King of Pruffia, or to any others inhabiting within any of His Countries, Territories, and Dominions, or as shall belong to the Town of Papenburgh, (except as aforefaid); and that fuch Powers and Clauses be inferted in the faid Commission as have been ufual, and are according to former Pre-cedents; and they are likewife to prepare and lay before His Majelty at this Board, a Draft of fuch Instructions as may be proper to be fent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Governments and Plantations for their Guidance herein ; as also another Draft of Instructions for fuch Ships as shall be commissionated for the Purposes abovementioned. and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Embargo now fubfilting upon all Ships and Veffels belonging to Hamburgh and Oldenburgh, be taken off: And it is hereby further ordered, That the Embargo be also taken off those Vessels belonging to the Towns of Bremen and Papenburgh, which had cleared out for Ports of the United Kingdom previous to the Pruffian Notification, dated Twenty eighth of March laft, whereby British Ships were excluded from the Ports of the Prussian Dominions, and from certain other Ports in the North of Europe; and that the faid Ships and Veffels, with their Cargoes, not being Pruffian, or Enemies' Property, be permitted to fail to any Port not blockaded: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treasury, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as may to them refpectively appertain. May it pleafe your Majefly, THE gracious Letter with which your Majefly hath been pleafed to honor this General Af fembly of the Church of Scotland, was received with the warmest Feelings of Respect and Gratitude.

The renewed Appointment of Lord Napier to reprefent your Royal Perfon in this Affembly, is to us, a most gratifying Pledge of your Majefly's firm Attachment to the Christian Religion, and tender Regard for the particular Rights and Privileges of the Church of Scotland; -his well known Zeal in the Caule of revealed Religion, and his long Experience in the Ecclefiaftical Affairs of Scotland, teach us to look to him with Confidence and refpectful Affection, as the fleady Friend of our National Church.

Met, as we now are, in Times of extraordinary Preffure and evident Danger both to Church and State, we feel that our Duties as Pallors of the Church of Scotland, are, in confequence, greatly multiplied, and our Refponfibility much increafed. Senfible that at no Period of our Hiftory have we ftood more in need of the Aid and Support of Re-ligion; that at no Time have found Principles and virtuous Practice been more necessary to our Prefervation as a Church and Nation. Entrufted with the Oracles of God, that we may influent our People and lead them in the Paths of Righteoufnels, we feel the strength of the Obligations which bind us, in this Hour of Trial, to a confcientious and vigorous Difcharge of our pattoral Duty.

Impressed with these Sentiments, and deeply af-fected with your Majesty's paternal Admonitions,

we do most folemnly pledge ourfelves, through the Affiftance of Divine Grace, to feed our Flocks with the wholefome Doctrines of the Gofpel,-to regu-late by the pure Standard of God's holy Word, the Morality which we teach, and fo to preach Faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, as that it may become a Motive to Newnels of Life. We pledge ourselves especially to lay to heart the Warning, To impreffively and feasionably given us by your Majelty, concerning the Attempts which fome have lately made to build on other Foundations, vainly relying on faile Philosophy and worldly Wildom. Knowing the Principles of fuch Men to be as impure in Itheir Source as debafing in their Tendency, we truft that we shall never forget the faceed Daty of keeping the Church of Scotland free from their Stain.

The Approbation which your Majefty is pleafed to beflow on our former Labours Thall animate our future Exertions to promote the Good of this Church, and the Welfare of the People under our Charge. We pray that the God whom we ferve may enable us to to adorn the one by our Life and Doctrine, and fo zealoufly and faithfully to watch over the other, that, by his Bleffing on our humble Endeavours, the Happinels and Prosperity of both may be advanced.

We entreat your Majefly to accept our humble Acknowledgments for your Attention to the Ad-vancement of religious Knowledge in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland. Your Royal Donation for this Purpole we shall faithfully endeavour to apply, to as most effectually to promote the Defign for which it is beftowed.

That Almighty God, the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jefus Chrift, may direct your Majefty's Councils. and profper your Government ;- that He may blefs our gracious Queen, their Royal High-neffes the Prince and Princefs of Wales, and all your Royal Family ;- that He may long preferve your Majesty to reign over a free, a loyal, and a virtuous People ;- and that He may, through Christ, bestow upon you hereafter an eternal Crown, are the Prayers of, May it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in this National Affembly of the Church of Scotland.

May it pleafe your Majefly, WE, your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, met in the General Affembly, beg Leave to approach the Throne of our gracious Sovereign with the unanimous Expression of our affectionate and zealous Attachment to your Perfon and Government.

The prefent Circumstances of National Danger unite the Exertions of all your Majesty's faithful Subjects; and the immense Accessions of Strength acquired by our Enemy on the Continent of Eu-rope, although they increase the Difficulties of the arduous Conteff in which the Nation is engaged, invigorate in our. Brealts every Sentiment of Loyalty and public Spirit. In the whole Courle of his un-exampled Career, the prefent Ruler of France has

never obtained any Triumph over Britain; and he has not hitherto been able even to attempt the Execution of his Threats of. Invation. The protecting Arm of Divine Providence has been extended over a Nation which has perfevered in opposing its Influence to the wild Progrefs of inordinate Ambition. A fucceffion of the most brilliant Naval Victories, clouded, alas! by the Death of Lord Vilcount Nelfon, but illumined by the Glory of many Heroes, who emulate his Fame, has given Security to our Shores, our Colonies, and our Commerce; and the Magnanimity and Patriotifm with which all Orders of Men combine their Efforts in maintaining the Independence of Britain; have been rewarded by its remaining, amidst the Wreck of Nations, a great and powerful State, with all its Inftitutions entire, with its Spirit unbroken, and its Dominions enlarged

And we trult in God, that the Wif-dom and Vigour of your Majefly's Councils, the 'Valour and good Conduct of your Fleets and Ar mies, and the Firmnels, Fortitude, and good Senfe of a loyal People, will enable your Majelly to conduct the Operations of a vigorous and fuccelsful War to an honorable Conclusion.

Deeply imprefied with a Senfe of the facred Duty which, at fuch a Time as this, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland owe to their Country, we pledge ourfelves to your Majefly that we will continue, in our feveral Stations, to exert our Influence with Alacrity and Zeal in cherifting those Sentiments of public Spirit which become a People who know the Value of their unrivalled Conflitution, and in promoting that Righteoufnefs which exalteth a Nation, which is the belt Exprefion of Gratitude to the God of our Fathers, and the belt Encouragement to hope that He will continue to blefs our Land.

The King has been pleafed to approve of Nicholas Köhne, Efq; to be Conful for the King of Denmark in the City and Port of Liverpool, and in all other Ports in the County-Balatine of Lancaster.

The King has also been pleased to approve of James Holmes, Esq; to be Conful for the United States of America at the Port of Belfast.

As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjetts of Great Britain, have, 'from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majesty, for preventing such Pructices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incar by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Schions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprifoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Diferention of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fhall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months, after Warning given by the Ambassiador, Minister, or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassiador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any

Justice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforefaid, fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Coun-try not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the Kings Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impri-fonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in cafe of a fubfequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly tain, any tuch roots or Otenins as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Of-fence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on hoard, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court

of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Selfion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin refpectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Cultoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer thall find on board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools to feized thall, after Condemnation, be publicly fold to the belt Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Veffel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Ma-jethy, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Supping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office

under His Majefty. One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall fue for the {ame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His prefent Majefly.
