AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 25th of June 1806,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of January last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh Day of July next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Com-

missioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Dacres, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Jamaica, to William Marsden, Esq; dated at Port-Royal, May 16, 1806.

SIR,

I INCLOSE, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Copy of a Letter I have received from Captain Wile, acquainting me of the Elk having taken one of the St. Jago de Cuba Row-Boat Privateers that had captured Two Droggers, one of which she was fortunate enough to recapture.

His Majesty's Sloop Elk, Lucea, May 12, 1806.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honor to inform you, that having received Intelligence off St. Ann's, the Evening of the 4th Instant, there was a small Spanish Privateer on the Coast which had captured Two Droggers; thinking it most probable they would stand over to Cuba in the Night, we made sail to the Northward, and on the Evening of the 5th, were so fortunate as to fall in with them off Cape Cruz, to retake one of the Droggers, and to capture La Cubaña Spanish Row-Boat Privateer, armed with One Swivel and small Arms; had been Five Days from St. Jago, her Crew originally consisted of Fourteen Men, but she had only Five on board when captured.

SIR,

I HAVE the Honor to inclose, for their Lordships' Information, the Copy of a Letter I have received from Captain Selby, of the Cerberus, acquainting me of his having captured, the Day before he arrived, a Privateer that was hovering about the Convoy.

His Majesty's Ship Cerberus, off the East End of Jamaica, 15th May 1806.

SIR,

I BEG Leave to acquaint you, that this Morning, as I was standing towards Jamaica, with a Convoy under my Charge bound to that Island, I discovered, at Dawn of Day, a Vessel of a suspicious Appearance hovering about the Fleet; I stood towards her, when she immediately hauled her Wind, under a Press of Sail; upon which I gave Chace, and in Two Hours had the good Fortune to come up with and capture her. She proves to be La Amable Theresa, belonging to St. Jago de Cuba, armed with Two Brads Howitzers, and Eighteen Men, and containing a Cargo of Wine and Merchandize, out Three Days from St. Jago de Cuba.

I feel much Satisfaction in having it in my Power to communicate to you the Capture of the above Vessel, as in the Event of her Escape she must have proved a great Annoyance to the Trade of this

Island, and particularly so to the large Convoy under my Command.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that on Tuesday Evening the 24th Instant, about Five o'Clock, the Reverend *George Parker*, Rector of *Oddingley*, in the County of *Worcester*, was most cruelly murdered in a Field, within the Parish of *Oddingley*, and within a short Distance of his own Dwelling-House, by receiving a Shot from a Gun, which entered the Right Side of his Body near the short Ribs, his Skull fractured, and his Head otherwise very much beaten with the Butt-end of such Gun; And whereas it hath been further represented to the King, that *Richard*

Heming, late of the Borough of Droitwich, but heretofore of the Chapelry of Norton, near Bredon, in the same County, Carpenter and Wheelwright, stands suspected as being the Perpetrator of such cruel and inhuman Murder. The said Richard Heming is about Five Feet Five or Six Inches high, right made, large Features, a large bald or high Forehead, dark Brown Hair, inclined to curl, black Beard, round Face, rather a wide Mouth, sharp Nose, dark Hazel Eyes, ruddy Complexion, had on at the Time when pursued, immediately after committing this diabolical Act, a dark Blue Coat with White Metal Buttons, which appeared too long for him, and a round old fashioned Hat with low Crown. The Evening after the Murder was committed the said Richard Heming was seen at Tiberton, Warn-don New Town, and Whittington, and is supposed to have with him Two Coats, the one being Blue Coat with White Metal Buttons, and the other a dark Brown Coat;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the atrocious Murder above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

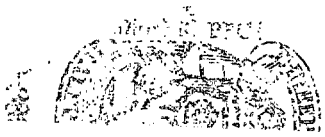
