Westminster, February 19, 180-. HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorifed by virtue of His Majefly's Commission for declaring His Royal Affent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, empowering the Lord Arch-bishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal

Affeat given to An Act for raifing the Sum of One Million by Treasury Bills, for the Service of Ireland, for the Year One thousand eight hundred and seven.

An Act to continue during the present War, and until One Year after the Termination thereof by the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, an Act, made in the Forty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty, for empowering His Majesty to accept the Services of such Parts of His Militia Forces in Ireland as might voluntarily offer themdelves to be employed in Great Britain.

An Act to abolish certain Offices in the Customs n Ireland, and to abolish or regulate certain other Offices therein.

An Act to continue, for the Term of Saven Years, certain Acts for the better Prevention and Punishment of Attempts to seduce Persons serving in His Majelly's Forces by Sea or Land from their Duty and Allegiance to His Majelly, or to incite them to Mutiny or Disobedience.

An Act to continue, for the Term of Seven Years, certain Acts of the Parliament of Ireland for preventing the Importation of Arms, Gunpowder, and Ammunition, and the making, removing, feiling, and keeping of Gunpowder, Arms, and Ammunition without Licence.

An Act for allowing the Exportation, annually, of a limited Quantity of Worlded Yarn to Canada.

An Act to declare, that certain Provisions of an Act of the last Session of the last Parliament, intituled " An Act to permit the free Interchange of every Species of Grain between Great Britain and Ireland," shall extend to Grain the Produce of those Countries only.

An Act to indemnify fuch Persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments, and for extending the Times limited for those Purposes respectively, until the Twenty-fifth Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and feven; and to permit fuch Per-fons in Great Britain as have omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors, to make and file the same on or before the First Day of Michaelmas Term, One thousand eight hundred and seven.

An Act to amend several Acts for regulating the Trial of Controverted Elections, or Returns of Members to ferve in Parliament, fo far as the fame relate to Ireland.

An Act to authorize His Majefly, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eight, to make Regulations respecting the Trade and Commerce to and from the Cape of Good Hope.

An Act for invelling certain Commissioners appointed for the Examination of Accounts and Expenditure relating to the Office of Barrack-Mafter-General, with certain Powers and Authorities neceffary for the Examination of fuch Accounts and Expenditure rich Themlen, who retired to the out
