Then, by His Majefty's Command, Rear-Admiral Sir Richard John Strachan was introduced into the Prefence between Sir Thomas Trigge and Sir David Dundas, the Two Junior Knights Companions prefent, preceded by the Gentleman Ulher of the Order, with Reverences as before.

The Sword of State was thereupon delivered to the Sovereign by Lord De Blaquiere, the Second Knight in Seniority prefent, and Rear-Admiral Sir Richard John Strachan, kneeling, was knighted therewith. Then His Royal Highnels the Duke of York, the Senior Knight, prefented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majefty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who, being thus invefled, had the Honour to kifs the Sove-reign's Hand, and withdrew. Then, by His Majefty's Command, Major-General

Sir John Stuart was, in like Manner, introduced into the Prefence between the faid Two Junior Knights Companions, preceded by the Gentleman Ufher as before ; and the faid Sir John Stuart being already a Knight, (that Honour having been conferred upon him by Patent under the Great Seal, bearing Date the 20th Day of June 1804,) His Royal Highnefs the Duke of York prefented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majelty invefted Sir John therewith ; who, having had the Honour to kils the Sovereign's Hand, withdrew, and the Proceffion re-turned in the Order before obferved.

The King has been pleafed to give and grant unto His Excellency the Right Honourable Charles Ar-buthnot, Ambaffador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Sublime Porte, His Royal Licence and Permiffion to accept and wear the Infiguia of the Ottoman Imperial Order of the Crefcent, conferred upon him by the Grand Signior :

And alfo to command, that this His Majefty's Conceffion and Declaration, together with the relative Documents, be regiltered in His College of Arms.
