AT the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 25th of November 1807,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the First Day of July last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of January parts. And whereas it is judged a vanishing for nuary next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Per-fon or Perfons who foever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the faid Eleventh Day of January next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mass, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mass, Yards, Bowsforits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet Copper, Sail-Cloth or fprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission afirst being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Expor-"tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Majelly's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majetty's

Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vel-sel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid fe-veral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majetly's Forts and Settle-ments on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Ex-portation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur-pofes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give sull and fufficient Security, by Bond, (except as here-inafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Com-missioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be caucelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majelty's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-fron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Greafe, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or

to any of His Majefty's Settlements in South Ame rica; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles fo exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the faid Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the faid Articles during the fame Seafon; and provided also that the Exportation of the faid Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the fame Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respec-W. SIR, Belleifle, Tortola-Roads, Nov. 3, 1807. 'HE inclosed Copy of a Letter from Lieute-nant Bird, of His Majesty's Sloop Superieure, acquainting me with the Capture of a Privateer, I fend for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

I am forry to observe to their Lordships that this Capture has occasioned a Loss to the Service of a most excellent Officer, Captain Buller, who was killed by a Musket-Ball in gallantly leading on his Men to board the Enemy, who was much superior in Numbers to his own Crew.

His Majesty's Brig Superieure, Barbadoes bearing W. 120 Leagues, Od. 17, 1807. THE unfortunate Death of Captain Buller imposes the Duty on me to inform you of the Capture of the French Schooner Privateer La Jopo L'Œil, after an Action of an Hour and a Quarter; in the early Part of which Captain Buller received a Musket-Ball through the Head, while in the act of attempting to board, and expired immediately. His Majesty's Brig Hawke was in Sight during the Chace, and joined an Hour after the Action had To the Officers and Crew of the Superieure I feel much indebted for their Support, par-ticularly Mr. Hawkey, the Mafter, and Mr. Gummage, Midshipman.

La Jopo L'Œil is a remarkable fine Veffel, pierced for Fourteen Guns; had only Six Eighteen-Pounders mounted, and One on a traverfing Carriage; manned with Ninety-five Men; out Thirty-two Days from Point à Petre, Guadaloupe, and had not made any

Blonde, at Sea, Lat. 12° 30' Long. 54° W. SIR,

SIR, 23d September 1807.

I HAVE much Satisfaction in informing you, that His Majesty's Ship Blonde, under my Command, captured at One A. M. the French Privateer Brig Dulqueine, late His Majesty's Schooner Net-ley, of Sixteen Twenty-four-Pound Carronades, One long Twenty-fix Pounder, Four Swivels, and One Hundred and Twenty Men, belonging to Guadaloupe. She had, on the 21st, captured the Brig Jassyes of Dublin, bound to Barbadoes in Ballast.

Having captured in fo fhort a Time, as little more than a Month, Four Privateers, I cannot conclude this Letter without recommending to your particular Notice, for his Exertions, Mr. Edward Jenkins, my

First Lieutenant.

P. S. Since she has been in the French Service they have given her a very complete Repair; added to her Length; fo that she is very fit for one of His Majesty's Vessels.

SIR, Blonde, at Sea, OBober 14, 1807. ON our Way to Surinam, in Latitude 20 N. and Longitude 57° 36' W. a Ship was feen at Daylight from the Mast-Head to the North West. Her Manœuvres and Appearance strongly indicated her to be an Enemy's Cruizer, and not unlikely to be that dangerous Privateer the Alert, who has done for much Injury to the Trade; this determined me to chace her, though it would run us far to the Westward. At Ten P. M. we had the Satisfaction of getting alongfide of her, when a few well-directed Shot induced them to strike their Colours. She proved to be the identical Alert, of Twenty Guns, long Nines and Sixes, One Hundred and Forty Men, last from Cayenne, had taken nothing.

It is fuch an Instance of Bravery and persevering Gourage, combined with great Prefence of Mind, as was fearcely ever exceeded. He has shewn such Ability in defending one of His Majesty's Packets, that I hope it will fecure him the Command of the first that is vacant.

Windfor-Castle Packet, Carliste Bay,

SIR, 3d October 1807.

HAVING, on my Passage from England in the Windsor-Castle Packet, with the Mails for Barhadoes and the Leeward Islands, been attacked by a French Privateer within the Limits of your Station, I take the Liberty of acquainting you, that we were fortunate enough to capture her after a fevere Action, and arrived with her fafe in this Bay. was feen on the Morning of the 1st of October in Latitude 13° 53' N. and Longitude 58° 1' W.; and about half-palt Eight made all Sail in Chace of the Packet, when every Exertion was made to get away from her; but finding it impossible, Preparations were made to make the best Resistance we could, and Arrangements to sink the Mails if ne-

ceffary

At Noon the Schooner got within Gun-shot, hoisted French Colours, and began her Fire, which was returned from the Stern-Chace Guns; this was continued until she came near, when we were hailed in very opprobrious Terms, and defired to strike the On refusing to do so she ran alongside, Colours. grappled the Packet, and attempted to board, which we repulsed by the Pikes, with the Loss of Eight or Ten Men on the Part of the Enemy, when the Schooner attempted to get clear by cutting the Grapplings, but the Main-Yard being locked in her Rigging the was prevented. Great Exertions were continued on both Sides; and I had occasion to station a Part of the Crew in Charge of the Mails, to thift them as Circumstances required, or to cut them away in case of our Failure. About Three we gotsome of our Six-Pounder Carronades to bear upon the Schooner, loaded with double Grape, Cannifter, and One Hundred Musket-Balls, which was fired at the Moment the Enemy was making a fecond desperate Attempt to board, and killed and wounded a great Number. Soon after this I embraced the Opportunity of boarding, in Turn, with Five Men, and fuceceded in driving the Enemy from his Quarters, and about Four o'Clock the Schooner was completely in our Possessian. She is named the Jeune Richard, noun ing Six Six-Pounders and One long Eighteen-Pounder, having on board at the Commencement of I junction with an Armed Prize from this Ship-

the Action Ninety two Men, of which Twenty-one were found dead on her Decks, and Thirty-three wounded. From the very superior Numbers of the Enemy still remaining, it was necessary to use every Precaution in fecuring the Prisoners. I was obliged to order them up from below one by one, and place them in their own Irons as they came up, as Three of our little Crew were killed, and Ten feverely wounded, the Mizen-Mast and Main-Yard carried away, and the Rigging fore and aft much damaged. It is my Duty to mention to you, Sir, that the Crew of the Packet, amounting at first to only Twenty-eight Men and Boys, supported me with the greatest Gallantry during the whole of this arduous Contest.

I HAVE the Honour to inform you, that His Majesty's Ship under my Command has captured La Maria Spanish Privateer Schooner, mounting One long Eighteen-Pounder, with a Crew of Seventy-four Men, after a Chace of Six Hours. She is last from Margarita, without having made any Capture, stored and provisioned for Three Months, and bound to Windward of Barbadoes. I feel particularly pleased in the Capture of this Vessel, as she is esteemed the fastest Sailer out of any of the Windward Islands. Her Commander has cruized with the greatest Success in different Privateers for the last Fourteen Years without being captured.

UR Will and Pleasure is, that all Vessels and their Cargoes coming from a Port of Russia direct to a Port of Our United Kingdom, which have already failed, or shall fail before the First Day of next January, shall not be interrupted by Our Cruizers, to whomfoever fuch Veffels and their Cargoes may belong. And in cafe any Veffel fo coming shall be detained and brought in, such Vessel, with her Cargo, shall be forthwith liberated, upon giving Bail to answer Adjudication, and shall be finally restored upon Proof that the Vessel was coming with the Goods for Importation into the United Kingdom, and the Matter shall be permitted to receive his Freight, and to proceed with his Vessel and Crew to any Port not blockaded of the Country to which the Veffel belongs.
