AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 16th of March 1808,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honourable Percy Clinton Sydney Viscount Strangford was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Edward Earl of Digby to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Dorset, and the Town of Poole, and County of the said Town, His Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to appoint Wilbraham Egerton, of Tatton Park, Esq; to be Sheriff of the County of Chester, in the Room of Robert Bamford, of Upton, Esq.

*Queen's Palace, March 16, 1808.*

This Day His Majesty was pleased to invest the Right Honourable George Earl of Aberdeen with the Ensigns of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle.

The Sovereign having signed the several Instruments for that Purpose, which were, previously to the Ceremony, presented to His Majesty by Robert Quarre, Esq; Gentleman Usher of the Green Rod, (in the Absence of the Secretary) the Earl of Aberdeen was called into the Royal Presence, being preceded by His Royal Highness the Duke of Clarence, one of the Knights Brethren of the Order, and supported by the Duke of Montrose and Earl Poulett, the Two Senior Knights present, one of His Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers (in Place of the Usher of the Green Rod) carrying the Sword of State. Upon entering into the Royal Presence, with the usual Reverences, the Earl was presented by the said Two Senior Knights, and, kneeling down, his Lordship was knighted by the Sovereign

with the Sword of State; the Earl, having kissed His Majesty's Hand, rose up, when the Gentleman Usher of the Green Rod administered the Oath to his Lordship; then Green Rod, kneeling, presented the Ensigns of the Order upon a Crimson Velvet Cushion to the Sovereign, who put the Ribbon over the Earl's Left Shoulder; and his Lordship, having again had the Honour of kissing His Majesty's Hand, withdrew, with the usual Reverences, in the same Manner in which he had entered.

The Ceremony was performed before the Levee, in His Majesty's Closet, several Great Officers of State and of the Court being present.

Then, by His Majesty's Command, Percy Viscount Strangford was introduced into the Presence between Sir Thomas Trigge and Sir David Dundas, the Two Junior Knights Companions present, preceded by the Gentleman Usher of the Order, with Reverences as before.

The Sword of State was thereupon delivered to the Sovereign by Lord De Blaquiere, the second Knight in Seniority present, and Viscount Strangford, kneeling, was knighted therewith; then His Royal Highness the Duke of York presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who, being thus invested, had the Honour to kiss the Sovereign's Hand, and withdrew; whereupon the Procession returned in the Order before observed.

*Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Russell, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels off the Texel, to the Hon. W. W. Pole, dated on board His Majesty's Ship Majestic, Yarmouth-Roads, the 18th Instant.*

SIR,

HEREWITH inclose a Letter from Lieutenant M'Culloch, Commander of the Princess Augusta Hired Cutter, giving an Account of his having driven the Dunkerquois, a French Privateer, on Shore at Katwick, on the 5th Instant; and of his having effectually destroyed her on the 8th; which I beg you will lay before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

SIR, *Yarmouth Roads, March 17, 1808.*

I HAVE the Honour to inform you, that whilst cruising, pursuant to your Orders, the Texel then bearing S. 40° E. distant Forty Miles, I fell in with, on the Evening of the 5th, and gave chase to a French Cutter Privateer, which, after a Chase of Twenty-four Hours, I drove on Shore at Katwick;

it then blowing too fresh for the Boats to attack her, and perceiving her Crew unrigging of her, I stood as close in as possible, and attacked her from the Cutter, which she returned; but on the Evening of the 8th, the Weather moderating, I sent my Boats in, and had the Pleasure of effectually destroying her, under a heavy Fire of Musketry from the Shore. She proved to be, from the Information of the Fishermen, the Dunkerquois of Dunkirk, mounting Four Three-Pounders and Forty-five Men; formerly His Majesty's Revenue Cutter Nimble, of Deal.

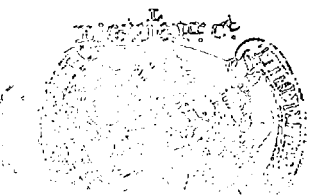
