PROCLAMATION

For pardoning fuch Seamen and Marines or have deferte I, and fail return into His Minjefty's Saraice on or before the Thirty-first Day of December west.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS We are defirous to give all due Encouragement to fuch Seamen as may have described from any of Our Ships duce the Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall be willing to return to Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Preclamation, and do hereby promife Our most gracious Pardon to all such Deserters as shall repair on board my of Our Ships or Veffels on or before the Thirty-fult Day of December next; and We do hereby further promife Our most gracious Pardon to all fuch Scamen as, having deferted, are now belonging to some one of Our Ships; and We do also hereby promise Our most gracious Pardon to all Marines who may have deferted from our Service fince the faid Tenth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, and shall on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of December next, surrender themselves at the Flead-Quarters of the Royal Marines ellablished at Ports. mouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to any Recruiting Party of Our faid Forces; and We do hereby declare, that all Seamen and Loyal Marines fo furrendering themselves as aforesaid, shall be released and discharged from all Profecutions, Imprisonments, and Penalties commenced or incurred by reason of any such Offence; but that such Pardon shall not entitle Deserters, whether Seamen, or Marines, to any Arrears of Pay forfeited by fuch Defertion: And We do hereby further declare, that all of Our Ships or Veillels of War, it at the Pleads of 868,

Quarters of the Royal Marines established at Portsmouth, Plymouth, or Chatham, or to some Recruiting Party of the faid Forces, or who shall hereafter ablent themselves from the Ships to which they belong, or from the Marine Quarters, without Leave from their Commanding Officers, shall be tried at a Court Martial, and being found guilty, shall be deemed unfit Objects of Our Royal Mercy, and shall suffer the Punishment of Death, or such other Punishment as they shall be condemned to suffer by Sentence of the faid Court.

Given at our Court at the Queen's Palace, the Fourth Day of May, One thousand eight hundred and eight, in the Forty-eighth Year of Our Reign.
