*As several Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings,*

*contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the following Abstracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.*

*Statute 5. George I. Chap. 27.*

**I**F any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Information in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister, or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorized by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Justice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforesaid, such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the said Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions; And if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpose aforesaid; he shall give such Security to the King not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

*Statute 23. George II. Chap. 13.*

**I**F any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of such Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on board his Vessel, he shall, for every such Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered

as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and, if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or sign any Cocket or Suffrance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the said Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

*Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His present Majesty.*

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utensil, or Implement whatsoever, used in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Possession of any such Articles, with an Intent to export the same to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above-mentioned, in the case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

#### BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be secured in Warehouse without Payment of Duty;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted as follows: "That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or described in the Table hereunto annexed marked (A), and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same under the joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in any Warehouse or Warehouses situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Customs or Excise due on the Importation thereof; subject, nevertheless, to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed by this Act: Provided always, that no such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be so lodged or secured, unless and until such Warehouses and other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, shall be so far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time

being, or any Three or more of them, the same shall be fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the same may respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of this Act; and the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of such Warehouses; which Certificate shall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London."

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the 16th Day of March 1804, the said Lords Commissioners did, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, certify and make known, that the following Warehouses belonging to the West India Dock Company, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament marked (A), and wherein the same might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; viz. All those Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses adjoining each other, and situate on the North Side of the large Dock belonging to the West India Dock Company at the Isle of Dogs, forming the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, from the West End to the East End thereof; and the said Lords Commissioners did thereby declare their Approbation of the said several Warehouses accordingly:

And whereas by the Ninth Section of the said Act it is further provided and enacted as follows: "That if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables to this Act annexed; and shall cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend, and be construed to extend, to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize in every Respect, in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing this Act."

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the 26th Day of March 1805, the said Lords Commissioners, pursuant and in Execution of the Powers vested in them in and by the said Act, did thereby declare that it appeared to them to be expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies (excepted in Table (B), annexed to the said Act); and that all Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, whether the same should have been shipped on board such Vessels in the West Indies,

or elsewhere, might respectively be safely and securely deposited in all or any of the Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses, hereinbefore described, and remain therein under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; and the said Lords Commissioners did further declare, that from and after the Publication of their Certificate in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the said Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act should extend, and be construed to extend, to all such Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in Table (A) annexed to the said Act at the Time of passing the same Act:

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the 5th Day of July 1805, the said Lords Commissioners did, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, further certify and make known, that the following Warehouses, belonging to the West India Dock Company, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were also fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament marked (A), and in which Warehouses such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, including Wines as aforesaid, might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; viz. All those Two several Stacks of Warehouses situate on the South Side of the large Dock belonging to the West India Dock Company at the Isle of Dogs; and the said Lords Commissioners did thereby declare their Approbation of the said Two last-mentioned Stacks of Warehouses accordingly:

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the 3d Day of November 1806, the said Lords Commissioners did, in pursuance of the said Act, further certify and make known that the large Warehouse belonging to the said Company, No. 10, at the East End of the said Dock was so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same was fit and proper for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act, and wherein the same might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act; and the said Lords Commissioners did thereby declare their Approbation of the said last-mentioned Warehouse accordingly:

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the 25th Day of September 1807, the said Lords Commissioners did, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, further certify and make known, that the large Warehouse belonging to the said Company, situate at the West End of the said Dock, was so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same was fit and proper for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act marked (A); and wherein the same might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Direc-

tions of the said Act; and the said Lords Commissioners did thereby declare their Approbation of the said last-mentioned Warehouse accordingly:

We, the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, further certify and make known that the large centre or middle Warehouse belonging to the said Company, situate on the South Quay of the said Import Dock at the Isle of Dogs aforesaid, and covering the Space between the Two Warehouses heretofore erected thereon, is so far completed, that, in our Judgment, the same is fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament marked (A), and also for the Reception of Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, whether the same shall have been shipped on board such Vessels in the West Indies or elsewhere, in like Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Table (A), as expressed in the said Certificate of the 26th Day of March 1805; and in which centre or middle Warehouse such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, including Wines as aforesaid, may respectively be safely and securely deposited and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act, and we do hereby declare our Approbation of the said centre or middle Warehouse accordingly.

#### BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating the Port of London, so far as the same relates to the Concerns of the West India Dock Company thereby established, and for extending to other Objects the Compensations directed to be made by the said Act;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted as follows:

"And be it further enacted, That when any one or more of the said Docks by the said recited Act and this Act authorized to be made and built by the said Directors, with the Basin or Basins, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses, and other Works belonging or to belong thereto, shall be so far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, the same shall be fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively, it shall be lawful for the said Lord High Treasurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, and he and they are hereby respectively authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known the same; which Certificate shall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London; and the said Certificate, so published as aforesaid, shall be deemed sufficient Notice to all Parties interested of the Completion of



the Dock or Docks, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses, and other Works concerning which such Certificate of Approbation shall be made; and from and after the Expiration of Ten Days next ensuing the first Publication of the said Certificate in Manner aforesaid, all the Rates and Duties by the said recited Act and this Act made payable to the said West India Dock Company, for Ships and Vessels entering into and using any of the said Docks, or any of the Basons and Cuts belonging, or which shall belong thereto; and also for any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize which shall be landed or discharged from any Ship or Vessel lying within any of the said Docks, or any of the Basons or Cuts belonging, or which shall belong thereto, shall commence, take effect, and become payable; and then and from thenceforth, such of the Quays and Wharfs then made or built by the said Company, as shall be described in such Certificate to be fit for the Reception of Goods, shall be deemed and taken to be legal Quays and Wharfs accordingly; and all the Provisions in the said recited Act contained, relating to the Increase of Interest or Dividends from and after the Completion of the said Docks, Cuts, Quays, Wharfs, Warehouses, and other Works, and for compelling Ships and Vessels that shall arrive in the River Thames with West India Produce on board, to unload and land the whole of such Produce within some or one of the said Docks, or on the Quays or Wharfs belonging, or which shall belong thereto, and for causing the King's Duties in respect of the same to be ascertained at such Quays or Wharfs, and not elsewhere; and compelling such Ships and Vessels belonging to or frequenting the Port of London, as shall be used or employed in the West India Trade, to ship or take in their respective Cargoes, and be loaded either in some or one of the said Docks, or in such Part of the River Thames as shall be below the Entrance into the intended Canal at Blackwall aforesaid, shall take Effect, and be in full Force and Operation; and the said Term of Twenty-one Years, during which the aforesaid Provisions are to be in Force, shall commence at and be computed from the Expiration of Ten Days from the Time of the first Publication of the said Certificate as before mentioned; any Thing in the said recited Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding."

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, granted on the 21st Day of August 1802, in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, the said Lords Commissioners did certify and make known, that the following Works, made and erected by the said West India Dock Company under the Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively; viz. The Entrance Basen at the East End of the said Works; the Great Dock; Three Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, numbered 2, 4, and 8, and the Quays or Wharfs from the North Side of the Lock at the East Entrance of the said Dock, along the North Side of the same Dock, and terminating at the North Side of the Lock at the West Entrance of the said Dock:

And whereas by another Certificate under the

Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, granted on the 22d Day of August 1803, in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, the said last-mentioned Lords Commissioners did further certify and make known, that the following Works, made and erected by the said West India Dock Company under the Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively; viz. The Entrance Basen at the West End of the said Works; also Ten additional Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, that is to say, Three large Warehouses numbered 3, 6, and 7; Three other large Warehouses, viz. one Warehouse adjoining the West End of the Warehouse No. 2, and called No. 1, the second Warehouse covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 4 and No. 6, and called No. 5, and the third Warehouse adjoining the West End of the Warehouse No. 8, and called No. 9; also Four other smaller Warehouses, — the first covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 2 and No. 3, — the second covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 3 and No. 4, — the third covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 6 and No. 7, — and the fourth covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 7 and No. 8; and which said Ten Warehouses, together with the Three Warehouses comprised in the said former Certificate, formed the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, from the West End to the East End thereof, and likewise one other Warehouse at the East End of the said Dock.

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, granted on the 29th Day of November 1803, in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, the said last-mentioned Lords Commissioners did further certify and make known, that the following Works, made and erected by the said West India Dock Company under the Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit for the Reception of all Sorts of Wood imported from the West Indies, which might be safely landed and stacked, or deposited thereon; that is to say, The Quays or Wharfs from the South Side of the Lock at the East Entrance of the said Dock, along the South Side of the same Dock, and terminating at the South Side of the Lock at the West Entrance of the said Dock:
