Copy of a Letter from Captain Baker, of His Ma-jesty's Ship Tartar, to Vice-Admiral Vasbon, Com-mander in Chief at Leith, dated off the Naze of Norway, November 3, 1808.

SIR, HAVE the Honour to acquaint you, that, at Two P. M. of this Date, being then Twelve Leagues N. by W. off Bovenbergen, with the Convoy under my Orders, a Sloop was observed from the Mast-Head in the N. N. E. having the Appearance of a Privateer, to which I gave Chace; and at Half past Five captured her. She proved to be the Danish Privateer Naargske Gutten, of Seven Guns, (Six and Four Pounders,) and Thirty-fix Men; quite new, one Day from Christiansand, and had not made any Capture.
