WHEREAS there was this Day read at the Board, the humble Memorial of Sir Lucas Pepys, Baronet, Physician to His Majesty, and President of the College or Commonalty of the Faculty of Physic in London, setting forth, that the said President and College have, with great Care, Pains, and Industry, revised, corrected, and reformed a Book by them formerly published, intituled "*Pharmacopœia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Londinensis*," prescribing and directing the Manner of preparing all Sorts of Medicines therein contained, together with the true Weights and Measures by which they ought to be made; which Book is now perfected, and ready to be published, and it is conceived will contribute to the Public Good of His Majesty's Subjects, by preventing all Deceits, Differences and Uncertainties in making or compounding of Medicines, if, for the future, the Manner and Form prescribed therein should be practised by Apothecaries, and others, in their Compositions of Medicines; the Memorialist therefore humbly prays that His Majesty will be graciously pleased to enforce the Observance thereof in such Manner as to His Majesty shall seem meet; His Majesty this Day took the said Memorial into His Royal Consideration, and being desirous to provide, in all Cases, for the common Good of His People, and being persuaded that the establishing the general Use of the said Book may tend to the Prevention of such Deceits in the making and compounding Medicines, wherein the Lives and Health of His Majesty's Subjects are so highly concerned, hath therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby to notify to all Apothecaries, and others concerned, to the Intent they may not pretend Ignorance thereof, that the said Book,

called *Pharmacopœia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Londinensis*, is perfected and ready to be published; and His Majesty doth therefore strictly require, charge, and command all and singular Apothecaries, and others whose Business it is to compound Medicines, or distil Oils or Waters, or make other Extracts, within any Part of His Majesty's Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, that they and every of them, immediately after the said *Pharmacopœia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Londinensis* shall be printed and published, do not compound or make any Medicine or Medicinal Receipt or Prescription, or distil any Oil or Waters, or make other Extracts that are or shall be in the said *Pharmacopœia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Londinensis* mentioned or named, in any other Manner or Form than is or shall be directed, prescribed, and set down by the said Book, and according to the Weights and Measures that are or shall be therein limited, except it shall be by the special Direction or Prescription of some learned Physician in that Behalf: And His Majesty doth hereby declare, that the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur His Majesty's just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for such their Contempt and Offences, according to the utmost Severity of Law.

WHEREAS His Majesty was, by His Order in Council of the Thirty-first of May One thousand eight hundred and nine, pleased to direct, that no Foreign Vessel, except as therein excepted, should enter into the Port, Harbour, or Road lying between the Island of Heligoland and Sandy Island, and the Shoals of the said Islands respectively, and commonly called or known by the Names of the

North Haven and the South Haven, under any Pretence whatever;

His Majesty is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to revoke so much of the said Order as respects Ships entering into the Port of the said Island or Places thereof, in Ballast; and to direct, that henceforth Merchant Vessels, under any Flag except the French, coming in Ballast, shall be allowed to enter therein without His Majesty's Licence: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *W. P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth Day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eight, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh Day of July next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by

Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purpose of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, except as hereinafter excepted,) to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure, nevertheless, that the following Articles, viz. Bar-Iron, White and Tarred Rope, Tallow or Mill Grease, Tarpaulins for Waggon-Covers, Pitch, Tar, and Turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon Payment of the proper Duties, without Bond being entered into by the Merchant Exporter, to any of the British Plantations in the West Indies, or to any of His Majesty's Settlements in South America; provided the Merchant Exporter shall first verify, upon Oath, that the Articles so exported are intended for the Use of a particular Plantation or Settlement, to be named in the Entry Outwards, and not for Sale; and that the said Plantation or Settlement has not before been furnished with any Supply of the said Articles during the same Season; and provided also that the Exportation of the said Articles shall, in no Case, exceed the Value of Fifty Pounds Sterling for any given Plantation or Settlement, whether by one or more Shipments within the same Season: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *W. Copy of a Letter from Captain Henry Boys, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop the Moselle, addressed to Vice-Admiral Rowley, Commander in Chief in Jamaica, and transmitted by the Admiral to the Honourable W. Wellesley Pole.

SIR, *Moselle at Sea, May 28, 1809.*

I BEG leave to acquaint you, that I have this Day, after a few Hours Chace, captured the French National Schooner Le Beau Narcisse, of Eight Guns and Fifty-five Men, commanded by Monsieur Louis Ores, Enseigne de Vaisseau; she left St. Domingo on a Cruise on the 7th of May.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain, to be secured in Warehouses without Payment of Duty," it was enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees of any Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or described in the Table thereunto annexed, marked (C), which shall be legally imported or brought into the Port of London, to land any such Goods, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Custom due on the Importation thereof; and such Goods may be lodged and secured at or in such Places, and under such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as the Commissioners of the Customs in England, or any Four or more of them, shall approve and direct, upon the said Importer, Proprietor, or Consignee entering into Bond to His Majesty, his Heirs, and Successors, with One sufficient Surety, to be approved of by the Collector and Comptroller of the Customs of the said Port of London, in double the

Amount of the full Duties due and payable on the Importation of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, with Condition that such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize shall be either duly exported, in the Manner and under such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions, so far as the same are applicable thereto, as by the said Act are directed in respect of Goods, Wares, or Merchandize secured in Warehouses as aforesaid, and exported directly from thence; or that the full Duties due and payable on the Importation of such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be paid to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs, within the Space of Twelve Months from the Date of the first Entry of such Goods; and it was further enacted, that if the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize not enumerated or described in either of the Tables annexed thereto, and should cause a List of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize to be published in the London Gazette, then and from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act shall extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said Tables respectively at the Time of passing the said Act:

We the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to and in Execution of the Powers vested in us, in and by the said Act, do hereby declare that it appears to us to be expedient, that the Provisions of the Act should be extended to Oil of Turpentine, legally imported or brought into the Port of London (not being imported by the United Company of Merchants of England, trading to the East Indies, or not being imported from the West Indies, and that such Oil of Turpentine should be added to the List of Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes enumerated and described in the Table annexed to the said recited Act, marked (C), and that such Oil of Turpentine should be lodged and secured at or in such Places as aforesaid, under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act: And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate in the London Gazette, conformably to the Directions of the said Act, all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of the said Act shall extend, and be construed to extend, to all such Oil of Turpentine in every respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the Table annexed to the said Act, marked (C), at the Time of passing the same Act.
