T is this Day ordered by His Majefty in Council, That the General Embargo laid by His Majefty's Order in Council, dated the Twelfth of last Month, upon all Ships and Veffels in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland (except as therein excepted) be taken off. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commilfioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir James Saumarez, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the Baltic, to the Honourable William Weilefley Pole, dated on board the Victory, off Nargen Ifland, 9th July 1809. SIR,

N my Arrival in the Gulf of Finland, having detached Captain Martin of His Majefty's Ship Implacable, with the Melpomene under his Orders, to cruize to the Ealtward of Nargen Island, I herewith inclose a Lift of Veffels which he has captured. the Admiralty; feveral of them being laden with Naval Stores belonging to the Emperor of Rullia. and which cannot fail proving a valuable Acquifition in England.

I also inclose, for their Lordships' Information, Copies of Two Letters 1 have received from Captain Martin of Yefterday's Date, one of them giving an Account of a molt gallant and enterprifing Attack made by the Boats of the Ships named in the Mar-gin," under the Orders of Lieutesant Hawkey of the Implacable, upon a Ruffian Flotilla of Gun-Boats, under Percola Point on the Coaft of Finland ; which, notwithstanding their strong Position, they fucceeded in carrying; Six of the Gun Boats mounting each a Thirty-two and Twenty-four Pounder, having been brought off, and another funk; together with the Veffels under their Protection, laden with Powder and Provisions for the Ruffian Army in Finland being captured, and a large Armed Ship which was burnt.

In referring their Lordships to Captain Martin's Detail of this important Service, I fincerely lament the Lofs to have been very confiderable ; Lieutenant Hawkey a brave and gallant Officer, who had diftinguished himfelf upon various Occafions, and Lieutenant Stirling of the Prometheus having been killed, and the feveral Men belonging to His Majefty's Ships, as in the inclosed Lift, having been killed and wounded.

I cannot close this without expressing my highest Admiration of the undaunted Courage and Intrepidity with which this Service has been executed, and which I doubt not will be duly appreciated by their Lordships.
