HEREAS the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are authorized by an Act passed in the 47th Year of His present Majesty, Cap. 51, intituled "An Act to extend the Provisions of an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, for abolishing Fees received by certain Officers and other Persons employed in the Service of the Cultoms in the Port of London, and for regulating the Attendance of Officers and others fo employed to the Out Ports, and to appropriate the Fees of certain abolished and vacant Offices in the Cultoms to the Superannuation Fund," to extend the Provisions of an Act passed in the 46th Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for abolishing Fees received by certain Officers and other Petfons employed in the Service of the Cultoms in the Port of Loadon, and for regulating the Attendance of Officers and others so employed," to any Port of Ports in Great Britain, and to the Officers, Clerks and other Persons so employed in the Service of the Customs therein.
