VICE ADMIRAL SIR JAMES SAUMAREZ, Bart. and K. His Majefly's Sloop Royalift, off Fecamp, SIR. December 18, 1810.

BEG Leave to inform you, that the French Lugger Privateer L'Aventurier, of Fourteen Guns and Fifty Men, was this Morning captured by His Majefty's Sloop under my Command, Fecamp bearing S. S. E. Five Leagues.

She is a very fine Veffel, only a Month old, had been out a few Days on her first Cruife, and had hot made any Capture.
