VICE-ADMIRAL SIR JAMES SAUMAREZ, Bart. and K. His Majesty's Sloop Royalist, off Fecamp, December 18, 1810.

SIR, I BEG Leave to inform you, that the French Lugger Privateer L'Aventurier, of Fourteen Guns and Fifty Men, was this Morning captured by His Majesty's Sloop under my Command, Fecamp bearing S. S. E. Five Leagues.

She is a very fine Vessel, only a Month old, had been out a few Days on her first Cruise, and had not made any Capture.
