TAKE the opportunity of sending in the Statira with another convoy, of acquainting you, immediately after the departure of the Lottery schooner, with a convoy of prizes to Bermuda, we have had the good fortune of making another valuable capture with the hoats of the squadron.

She proves to be the armed letter of marque Cora, of eight guos and forty men, two hundred and liftyeight tons, coppered and copper-fastened; her first voyage, and esteemed the fastest schooner out of Baltimore; from Bourdeaux, laden with brandy, wine, silks, and flints, &c. &c. a cargo of great amount; I am happy to add the squadron has suf-fered no loss upon this occasion from the fire of the Cora's guns.
