## Dowining-Street, October 6, 1813.

It gives me-great satisfaction to report; that the Spanish troops engaged, viz. the regiments of Ba:dajoz, Tiradores de Cadiz, sud Voluntarios de Aragon, being a brigade of infantry belonging to $\mathrm{Ge}-$ neral Sarstield's division of the secend army, behaved remarkably well, as well as the 2d battalion 27 th regiment, the Caiabrese light infantry, and the piffec companies of the ath line batalion Kingts German legion, and of De Rolls: zeginemit. In consequence of this event Lieutenant-General Lord Willian Bentinck rétired tö 1 th neighbourbood of Tarragona, and, the enemy have 1 , mnderstand, again fecrossed the Lobregat: -anyt che Elt
Nothing extraordinaty fits occurred in front of thẹ arny under mpana imediate compuad.

SII, Tarragona, September 15, 1813. AGREEAREX to youf directionts, I: beg lentic to reporit to you the followiug otduprences, which -took place an'the night of the 101 in instant:

The enomy attacked the position of Ordap at about midhisht: I tefonded an, old work, which comananded the main toad, with the rifo companies of De.Roll's pegimenti and that of whe 4th bytalinn King's German legion, besides two conpanits of the 27 th regiment: We resisted a considerable time the repeated, attacks of the enemy, but our ranks beluit at last much thinned, whilst the attacks iff the enemy tecame move and mare ingueturous, :we were at last driven from the' oda' redeabt: I I rallied the troops abont sixty paces in rear of it, behind'some old ruins, from shion placerve succeeded twice to retake the lighther phte of our orid position, attacking, in conjunction wifuthe Spandsh
 fought and haliarged with the grehtest inetrepillity.

We:thel fmentr: for about aus hour and thalf on theae spitsy, when Batron. Getnhins came up, and
 trops there, Colonels $\Lambda$ dam and Reores wese

monnded. I immeenately procceded to the right, where the 27 th regiment was posted, aud destrell some of my party to follow me.' I bad 'scatcely joined them, when I was informed, that the eneny were turning otur right ands; I otcasioned this to be reiaforced, but it was in vain they attempted to withstand any longer, the enemy contimuing to gaia ground. At the same noment I saw the Spanish brigade on our left setiriag; there was not a momens to be lost, and I ordered the 27th regiment to retire. We gained the main road, for the purpose of arriving at a hill, in rear of the first position, before the enemy could get possession of it: in this we succeedet. We continued our retreat, keeping close to the right of the main road, during the whole night, meeting at sereral times parties of the encmy on all sides. I was in hopes that by daylight, the progress of the latter would be stopped, ant offer me the means of joining some of our troops; but being disappointed in this, I gained by $t$ tiat time the ligher part of the woods, and was not discovered by the enemy till - baxd gained the widnnge of Ronneoles, but his attempt to prevent ourfiretreat was fruitiess.

Our match was of the most fatiguing thature that can be imagined; many men, wom out by fatigue, remained behind, so that the party: with which I joined the first division (by, about tive o'elock in the afternoon), consisted only of about seventy men; but I can assert, that a great number ard still in the woods, and will be able to join.

I have onitted to say, that the artillery under Captain Arebin had becis ertherei to retire abolt half, an hour before the position was forced, hned peevious to my succeding to the command The guns have been overtaken by the entuy's eavalry near Venta de Ordal.

Tarragona, Scptember 15,1813
ON the night of the 12 th instant, about twelve o'clock, the enemy, in great force, attacked the position of the $2 d$ battalion 27 th regiment at Ordal; andshorty atter, Lieutemant-Coloned Reeres and Captain Mills being wounded, the command of the battalion devolved upon me. At this timie the fi:e from the enemy"s sharp-shooters was extremely heary, as well as that of his artillery, under cover of which heavy colums of infantry were advancing upon my front and upon my right flank. Notwithstanding the inferionity of my force, and the loss atrosty su tained, I was detersined to 4oen m, gyouders long as possible, more especia fy riber mitneseal the gallant, Ifrave, and deter mimatuconduet of tue spranish troops on my left, who clurged with the bayonet three tizoes, and fosped-the emeny to retire with great loss.
I conitnued to naintrim the positions for ap honr and three quirters, exposed to an incespor fipe along my froat, the eacmers light trodimW my





My left being thits uncovered, I concenved it my duty to save as many as I could collect of the battalion, and accordingly I retired, with five officers, eigbt serjeants, and sixty-six rank and file, under a heavy fire, and follow ed by the enemy's cavalry:

If bog leave to state, that nothing could exceed the beave determined conduct of the officers and mon of the 2 d battalion 27 th regizent; and I feel it justice to mention the good conduct of: Lieutenant Felix, of the royal marinesy? attiched to the battalion.

Whave the satisfaction to add, that many of the trave men, who were anavoidably thepersed daring the action, have since joined; and I trust our Lose altogethar will not exceed two hundred meu.

AS the official reports made to the Conmmenaz of the Forces, by the different officess upen whont the commaud of the adrance dewolved, at shestracix of the beights of Ordal, on the uight of the 12th instant, camot, otving to the circunstanefa in onjech thet, troops weie placed after the buights were carried by the enenay, detail the parcieydes attending the loss of the brigade of guns utrder any



 in consequejace of the fincumptancat mot doing: rightiy uiderstpod.

I feel couthdent that he Cannapinder of the Fioners, as well as ercry p ficer in this arroy, are contioecd. of the impracticability of briaging off ongems,
 theless should you deem it nepessary to shew this letter to his Excellency (to whom 1 have alrandy had the honour of reporting the business verbelly). you are at liberty to do so. Shordly after the action commenced Colonel Adam was severely wounded and obliged to quit the feld, the command then
 perceiving that the enemy was gaining grobid on all sides, gave me oxters toretire with the guns: I accordingly withdresy them aboyt one buwdred yarth, when perceiving that the Spanish troops who had given way on the lefe of the töat, han rallied and returned to the "cbatiger I halked the gurs, being' fearful of the effect cleitherwat migthe bhe ve on the minds of the soldiets.

Pievious to this period', Cotermate Comen Reeves had gone to the rear, severely nontided; Lieitenant-Colonol Carey (the irete in commend) was posted so far to the left, that 1 could receive io otderfi from him; all the other offerss who were senidy to"ne,'inere either wounted, or at so grgat a

it.was abselutely necessary to remain on the ground, and again to bring the guns up to the support of the Spaniards, should they be so fortunate as to repulse the eneny. But the numbers of the enemy, who continued to bring forward fresh troops, at last prevailed, and the infantry (British and;Spanish $)$-were, after a most determined and obstinate resistance, obliged to withdraw from the heights, aind to retire through the mountains to the right and Ieft of the road, I then commenced retreating witli: the guns, covered by about fifty cavalry (Spus niards); and an officer and twelve men of the 27 th . In abont lalf an hour the, Ath hussais came lin with us, and, attacking the covering party of dratouns, obliged then to retreat with so much precipitation, that, in the confusion which they occasioned by galloping past the guns on a causcway, it was impossible to umlimber, and the Freach cavalry followed them up so closely, thige I found we were suirrounded, even before 1 knety thie cause of this sudden movenent of the Spariards,
The eneny guarded their prisoncrs, baplly; it being nipht I had myself the good fortune to escape by rifing on with the French hussars, who continued theif parsiit of the Spaniards, after they had placed a, guapd gree the gins'; and I bave the satiataction to add, that the greater part of the non-commissipneft officers tand guaners have effected their escape inty the montain amp Have joined the army, with the different detachouents of infantry which. Jyete begergonstantly comjog, in siuce the night of ithe actipnemorionion incs.
