WHEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the twenty-third day of July last, for prohibiting the exportation out of this kingdom, or carrying coastwise, gunpowder or salt petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's service, and the safety of this kingdom, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness, in the name and on the bebalf of His Majesty', and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Priry

Council, doth, thesefore, hereby order, :require, prohibit, and command; that ac person or persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordiance for His Majesty's service) do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport into any parts out of this kingdom, or carry coastwise, any gunpowder or salt petre, or any sort of arns or ammunition, or ship or lade any gunpowiter or salt petre, or any sort off arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, in order to trausporting the same into any parts beyond the seas or carrying the same coastrwise, without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act, passed in the twenty-ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to empower "His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of salt "petre, aud to enforce the law for empowering " His Majesty to prohibit the exportation of gun"f pawder, or any sort of arms or anmunition, $\therefore$ and also to ermpower His Majesty to restrain the "c carrying coastwise of salt petre, gunpowder, or " any sort of arms or ammunition ©s. But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the exportation of any of the articles; specified in the Order in Council of the twentieth of May one thousand eight hunIred and thirteen, to the coast of Africa, under the conditions contained in the said Order. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His 'Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great. Britain, the Lord Warden of the. Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance; and His Majesty's Secretary at Warj are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

biting, in the name and ome behalf of His Majesty, the transporting into any parts out of this kingdom of any pig iron, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, or other naval stores, has expired; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's service, and the safety of this kingdom, that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Kegent, in the name and on the beLalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, probibit, and command, that no person or persons whosoever do, at any time for the space of six months from the date of this Order, presume to transport into any parts out of this kingdom, any pig iron, bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, anchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, sail-cloth or canvas, or other naval stores (sheet copper excepted), or do ship or lade any pig iron; bar iron, hemp, pitch, tar, rosin, turpentine, auchors, cables, cordage, masts, yards, bowsprits, oars, oakum, sailcloth or canvas, or other naval stores (sheet copper excepted), on board any ship or vessel, in order to trasporting the sameinto any parts beyond the seas, witbont leave or permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring the forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to enable
"His Majesty to restrain the exportation of naval 'f stores; and. more effectually to prevent the ex" portation of salt petre, arms, and ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in ". Council;" But it is nevertheless His Royal Kighness's pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's ships of war, or any other ships or vessels or boats in the service of His Majesty; on employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any ship or vessel from taking or having on hoard such quantities of naval stores as may be necessary for the use of such ship or vessel during the course of her intended voyage, or by licence from the Lord High Admital of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the time being; nor to the exportation of the said several articles to Ireland, or to His iHnjesty's yatds or garrisons, or to His Majesty's colo-
nies and plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's forts and settlements on the coast of Africa, or to the island of Saint Helena, or to the British settlements or factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the exportation of any of the said articles for the purposes of trade to Ircland, or to His Majesty's yards and garrisons, or to His Majesty's colonies and plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's forts and settlements on the coast of Africa, or to the island of Saint Helena, or to the British settlements or factories in the East Indies, the exporters of such articles do first make oath of the true destination of the same to the places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient security by bond (except as hereinafter excepted), to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry. the said articles to the places for which they are .so entered outwards, and for the purposes specified, and none other; and such bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until proof be made to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the production, within a time to be fixed by the said Commissioners and specified in the bond, of a certificate or certificates, in such form and manner as shall be directed by. the said Commissioners, shewing that the said articles have been all duly landed at the places for which they were entered outwards. But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, nevertheless, that the following articles, viz. bar iron, white aud tarred rope, tallow or mill grease, tarpaulins for waggon covers, pitch, tar, and turpentine, shall be permitted to be exported, upon payment of the proper duties, without bond being entered into by the merchant exporter, to any of the British plantations in the West Indies, or toany of His Majesty's settlements in South America; provided the merchant exporter shall first verify, upon oath, that the articles so exported are intended for the use of a particular plantation or settlement, to be named in the entry outwards, and not for saie, and that the said plantation or settlement, has not before been furnished with any supply of the said articles during the same season; and provided also that the exportation of the said articles shall in no care exceed the value of filty pounds sterling for any given plantation or settlement, whether by one or more shipments, within=
