## MEMORANDUM.

The Christian name of Lieutenant Martin, of the 28th Regiment, is Robert, and not Richard, as stated in his appointment as Ensign and Lieutenant.

The Christian names of Cornet Brown, of the 13th Light Dragoons, are William Augustus, and not George Augustus, as formerly stated.

The Christian name of Ensign M'Carthy, of the 22d Foot, is Richard, and not Charles, as formerly stated.

Lieutenant James Rooke, of the Staff Corps of Cavalry, is superseded, being absent without leave.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Lieutenant-General Sir James Leith, Commander of His Majesty's Forces in the West Indies, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, and Honorary Knight Commander of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, His Majesty's royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the grand cordon of the Order of Military Merit of France, with which His Most Christian Majesty hath been pleased to honour him, as a mark of the high sense entertained by that Sovereign of the great zeal, ability, and energy manifested by the said Sir James Leith in the month of August 1815, throughout the arduous operations whereby, with the forces under his command, he effected the surrender of the important island of Guadaloupe, and secured the French colonies in the West Indies to the Crown of France:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Robert Travers, Esq. Colonel in the Army, Lieutenant-Colonel of the 10th (or North Lincolnshire) Regiment of Foot, and Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, His Majesty's royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the cross of a Commander of the Royal Sicilian Military Order of St. Ferdinand and of

Merit, with which His Majesty the King of the Two Sicilies hath been pleased to honour him, as a testimony of the high sense which that Sovereign entertains of the distinguished gallantry displayed by the said Colonel Travers in the field in different affairs with the enemy while commanding the advanced guard of the Anglo-Sicilian army on the coasts of Italy; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Dudley St. Leger Hill, Esq. Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, Colonel in the Portuguese Service, and Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, His Majesty's royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the insignia of a Knight of the Royal Portuguese Military Order of the Tower and Sword, with which His Majesty the King of Portugal hath been pleased to honour him, as a testimony of the high sense which that Sovereign entertains of the great courage and intrepidity displayed by the said Lieutenant-Colonel in several actions with the enemy in the Peninsula; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms:

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
