The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Edward Tichborne, of Snarford-hall, in the county of Lincoln, Esq. third but second surviving son of Sir Henry Tichborne, of Tichborne, in the county of Southampton, Bart. deceased, His royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may take the name of Doughty only, instead of that of Tichborne, and also bear the arms of Doughty quarterly with those of Tichborne, the arms of Doughty in the first quarter; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise the said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
