NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Commissioners of the Northern Lighthouses give notice, that the four following Lighthouses, viz. Kinnaird Head, in Aberdeenshire; Island Glass, one of the Harris Isles; Mull of Kintyre, in Argyllshire; and Island Pladda, at the entrance of the Frith of Clyde; have recently been improved in brilliancy and effect, without however altering their characteristic appearance as stationary lights. Pladda exhibits two distinct lights, the one above the other, and, from the increased elevation of the towers, the lights will now appear like stars of the first magnitude, at the distance of five or six leagues, and intermediately according to the state of the atmosphere, instead of from three to four leagues distance as formerly.
