VICE-ADMIRAL Sir Pulteney Malcolm has transmitted to the Right Honourable John Wilson Croker, a letter from Commander Nias, of His Majesty's sloop *Alacrity*, reporting, that a piratical *mistico*, which had plundered a small vessel under Ionian colours, and committed other depredations, was captured, on the 11th of January last, near Cape Paillouri, in the Archipelago, by the *Alacrity's* cutter, under the orders of Lieutenant Charles Frederick.

On the approach of the boat, the pirate fired into her, but the boat immediately ran alongside, and the pirate was gallantly boarded and carried by Lieutenant Frederick and his boat's crew. The Captain of the *mistico*, a noted pirate, named Giorgio, and one of his men, were severely wounded, and, with two others, made prisoners, and sent to Malta for trial. The rest of the pirate's crew jumped overboard, and were either drowned or made their escape by swimming to the shore.

In performing this service, Lieutenant Frederick was severely wounded; as also Mr. Charles C. Austin, Midshipman; James Stirling, seaman; and John Dixon, corporal of marines; and Joseph Massey, a private marine, was slightly wounded.

POWERFUL TIDE MILL AT PORTSMOUTH.
