Westminster, May 14, 1829.

TTHIS day, the Lords being met, a meszage was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the imnsediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to continue compositions for the assessed taxes, for a further terin of one year.

An Act to carry into execution the stipulations of a Convention between His Majesty and His Catholic Majesty, for the settlement of certain British claims upon Spain, and of certain Spanish claims upon the United Kingdom.

An Act to facilitate the public business, in certain cases in the Navy and Victualling Departments.

An Act for repealing several Acts relating to the charity for the relief of the poor widows of commissioned and warrant officers in the Royal Navy, and for substituting other provisions in lien thereof.

An Act to explain, amend, and alter the Act of the ninth year of the reign of His present Majesty, for regulating the care and treatment of insane persons in England.

An Act to explain and amend an Act of the Parliament of Scotland, intituled "An Act concerning the registration of seisuis and reversions of tenements within burgh."

An Act to provide, until the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty-
four, for the government of His Majesty's settlements in Western Australia, on the western coast of New Holland.
An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirtytwo, certain Acts relating to the island of Newfoundland, and the fisheries carried on upon thebanks and shores thereof.

An Act to continue the operation of an Act, of the seventh year of His present Majesty, for suspending the provisions of an Act of His late Majesty, respecting the appointment of Writers in the service of the East India Company; and to amend the provisions of an Act of the forty-seventh year of His late Majesty, so far as they relate to the period of residence at Hertford College as a qualification for certain offices.
An Act for the improvement of the harbour of Aberdeen.

An Act for enabling the Liverpool and Manchester Railway Company to make an alteration in the line of the said railway; and for amending and enlarging the powers and provisions of the several Acts relating thereto.
An Act for making a railway from the Bolton and Leigh Railway, in the township of West Leigh, to the Liverpool and Manchester Railway, in the township of Kenyon, with a branch therefrom, in the county of Lancaster.

An Act for making and maintaining a railway or tramroad from the Liverpool and Manchester Railway, at or near Wargrave-lane, in Nowton in Mackerfield, to Warrington, in the county palatine of Lancaster, and two collateral branches to communicate therewith.
An Act to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers of an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, for making and maintaining the Duffyn, Llynvi, and Porth Cawl Railway, and other works connected therewith.

An Act for paving, watching, lighting, cleansing,

and otherwise improving the town of Ryde, in the Isle of Wight, in the county of Sonthampton, and for establishing a market within the said town.

An Act for paving, lighting, watehing, cleansing, regulating, and improving the town of South Slirelds, in the coungry palatine of Durham.

An Act for better paving, cleansing, lightings, watching, and improving the streets, lanes, and other public places and passages within the city of Aberdeen, and certain grounds adjacent; for regulating the police thereof; and for supplying the inhabitants with water.
An Act for enlarging the market-place in the town of Basingstobe, in the county of Southampton, and for fixing and regulating the markets of the said town; and for establishing a market for live cattle adjoining the same.

An Act to amend an Act, passed in the ninth year of His present Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled" An Act for building a bridge over the River Thames, at Staines, in the county of Middlesex, and for making proner approaches thereto."
An Act for raising money to defray the expences of rebuilding Marlow-bridge.

An Act for rebuilding the bridge over the River Clyde; opposite Jamaica-street, in the city of Glasgow.

An Act for altering, extending, and improving the Exeter Canal.
An Act to consolidate and extend the powers and provisions of the several Acts relating to the Oxford Canal Navigation.

An Act for making and maintaining a pier at or near Southend, in the parish of Prittlewell, in the county of Essex, and for making convenient approiches to and from the same.
An Act to regulate, repair, and maintain the ferry of Kincardine across the Frith of Forth, and the accesses connected therexwith.
An Act for erecting and endowing a church, in Albercrombie-square, in the parish of Liverpool, in the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for building a new court-house for the liberty and borough of Saint Alban, in the county of Hertford.
An Act for applying, in the purchase and redemption of 'part of the land tax charged upon the district or division of the duchy liberty, and the Westminster liberty of Saint Clement Danes, Saint Mary-le-Strand, and the precinct of the Savoy, in the county of Middlesex, certain sums of stock standing in the name and to the credit of the Accountant-General of the Court of Chancery.

An Act for confirming an agreement between the Treasurer and Masters of the Bench of Lincoln's-inn and the Governors and Directors of the Poor of the united parishes of Saint Andrew, Holborn, above the Bars, and Saint George the Martyr, Middleses.
An Act to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers of an Act of His present Majesty's reign, intituled An Act for èstablishing an additional compamy for lighting the city and suburbs of Dublin with gas."

An Act for repiating the road from the east end of the town of Newmagket, over Newmarket-heath, to the tumpike road to Stump-cross, in the counties of Cambridge and suffilf, and the road branching out of the aforesaid yoad, near the Devil's-ditch on Newmarket-heath, to the present turnpike road to Cambridge.

An Act for making and repairing the road from the bridge over the River Cowie, near Storre Haverf, to the road along the south bank of the River Dee, at or near to Park-head or Millbank of Maryculter, iin the county of Kingardine.

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient, that the port of Pictou, in Nowa Scatia, should be *ppointed a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in him vested in and by the said Act of Parliament, order and appoint, that :flie:saidiport of Pictou, in Nova Scotia, shail be afiee warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Londs Commissioners of His 3 rajesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Sir Greirge Murray, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fiftyseventh year of His late Majesty's reign, cap. 57, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty "to:suspend the training and regulate the quiotas of " the militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by any Order or Orders in Council, to suspend the calling out of the militia of the United Kingdom, or of any part of the United Kingdom, or of ainy county, riding, shire, stewartry, city, town, or place, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in any year, and to order and direct that no training or exercising of the militia of the United Kingdom, or of any part of the United Kingdom, or
of any connty or countics, riding or ridings, shire or shires, stewartry or stewartries, city or cilies, town or towas, or place or places, specified in any sueds Order or Orders in Comncii, shall take place in any year, any thing contained in any Act or Acts of Parliament rclating to the militia to the contrary notwithstanding: and whereas it is doemed expedient, that such training or exercising should be dispensed with in the present year; it is ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the calling out of the militia of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, for the purpose of being trained and exercised in the present year, be suspended; and that no training or exercising of the said militia do take place in the present year.

WHEREAS the time linnted by His Majesty s Order in Council, of the seventh of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder, salt-petre, or any sort of arms or mununition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), lras expired; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the said probitition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore thereby order, require, and command, that no person or persons whatever '(except the Master-Genneral of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to conmence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arnis or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gunpowder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammur nition, on board any ship or vessel, for the transporting of the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties imposed in that behalf by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general "regulation of the Customs!"

And the Right Honcurable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the 'Ordnance, and His Majesty's Sceretary at Wex, are to give the necessajy directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
