The King has been pleased to grant unto Lieutenant-Colonel Gideon Gorrequer, Knight of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, His Majesty's royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the insignia of a Knight Commander of the Royal Sicilian Military Order of St. Ferdinand and of Merit, which His Majesty the King of the Two Sicilies has been pleased to confer upon the said Lieutenant-Colonel, in testimony of that Sovereign's approbation of his distinguished conduct in face of the enemy, during the occupation and defence of Sicily, and at the taking of Genoa in 1814, on which occasion the Sicilian troops were employed in conjunction with those of England, under the command of Lieutenant-General Lord William Bentinck:

And His Majesty hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and especial mark of His royal favour, together with the relative documents, be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
