REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE KING'S LEVEES, AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to

attend His Majesty's Levees at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two cards with their names thereon written, one to be left with the King's Page in attendance in the Presence-Chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, who will announce the name to His Majesty. And those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Gentleman who is to present them (not the Lord in Waiting), should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's-Office, BEFORE twelve o'clock on the Monday previous to each Levee, in order that they may be submitted for the King's approbation; *it being His Majesty's command, that no presentation shall hereafter be made at the Levee, but in conformity with the above regulations; and further, that no person shall be admitted, on any pretence whatever, who has not been so presented.*

It is particularly requested, that Gentlemen who are to be presented at the Levees will have their names *distinctly* written upon the card to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them to the King:

Whereas under the Royal Charter of Confirmation, granted by His late Majesty King James the Second, to the ancient Body of Shipmen and Mariners of England, commonly called "the Corporation of Trinity-house of Deptford Strond," the Members of the said Corporation are, in themselves, their servants, apprentices, and ships, to be charged, and employed, at one hour's warning, in His Majesty's service at sea, in and for the good and necessary defence of His Majesty's realms and kingdoms: and it hath long been the usage for the Master, Deputy Master, and other Elder Brethren of the said Corporation, to wear an appropriate uniform;

His Majesty hath been graciously pleased to take the premises into His royal consideration, and having regard to the duty and service with which the Members of the said Corporation are especially charged as aforesaid, hath directed that the uniform to be henceforth worn by the Master, Deputy Master, and other Elder Brethren of the said Corporation, shall be as follows, viz.

COAT—Blue cloth, with a scarlet cloth stand up collar; a slashed sleeve, with scarlet three pointed flap, and three buttons and button holes; a scarlet cuff; pocket flaps, with three points and three buttons; the body of the coat lined with the same cloth, and the skirts lined with white kerseymer; the buttons to be raised gilt, seven eighth parts of an

inch in diameter, and convex, bearing a shield quartered with the arms of the Corporation, and having the motto, "Trinitas in Unitate," forming a three quarter circle round the lower part thereof: in all other respects the coat is to accord with the pattern which has been approved by His Majesty.

WAISTCOAT—Single breasted white kerseymere, with buttons, one half of an inch in diameter, of the same pattern as those on the coat.

TROUSERS—Of blue cloth, from the 1st November to 30th April; and of white Russia drill, from the 1st May to 31st October; and to be worn at all times over boots.

CRAVAT—Black silk.

HAT—Round black.

On all occasions of attendance upon His Majesty, or when present at the King's or Queen's Drawing-Rooms, or when employed on the especial duty and service before mentioned, and on other occasions of an especial description, the Master, Deputy Master, and other Elder Brethren, are to wear gold epaulettes, swords, and cocked hats with cockades, of the patterns respectively which have been approved by His Majesty.
