late attempt of injury to your royal person, and to assure your Majesty that it is with the most heartfelt pleasure we join with all your Majesty's other loyal and dutiful subjects, in rejoicing at your Majesty's happy escape. And, sincerely praying for a long continuance of your Majesty's reign, we are your Majesty's most liege subjects.
