*Board of Green Cloth, St. James's-Palace,
May 8, 1835.*

NOTICE is hereby given, that all carriages coming to Her Majesty's Drawing-Room at St. James's-Palace, on Thursday the 14th of May, are to fall into the line at the top of St. James's-street, come down the left hand side of the street, round the corner of Pall-mall, and enter at the iron gate nearest to the Palace, set down at the Arcade, return by the iron gate nearest to Marlborough-house, and pass through Pall-mall into St. James's-square. In taking up, they are to come down St. James's-street in like manner, pass through the same gates, and go away through Pall-mall.

No hackney coaches will be permitted to come within the iron gates, they must set down at the outside thereof, and go away through Pall-mall.

The gate at the top of Constitution-hill will be open only for the carriages of persons having the privilege of the *entrée*, which are to proceed down the Park, and enter the Palace at Stable-yard-gate, turn into the Ambassadors'-court, set down at the Arcade, and go out into Cleveland-row. The carriages of the Cabinet Ministers and Great Officers of State may afterwards wait in the King's-court, those of the Ambassadors and Foreign Ministers in the Ambassadors'-court, and those of all other persons having the *entrée* may wait in Stable-yard or St. James's-park, till called for; they are then to take up in the same order as they had set down, pass away into Cleveland-row, and up the left hand side of St. James's-street.

No carriage will be admitted with company a second time with the same ticket, to prevent which, it must be produced at Constitution-hill-gate, and at Stable-yard-gate also, where a corner of it will be torn off by the Marshalmen in attendance; and no person can be allowed the privilege of the *entrée* by any other approach to the Palace than the gates above mentioned.

Tickets for carriages belonging to persons having the *entrée* will be delivered at the Board of Green Cloth, St. James's-Palace, on Tuesday next, between the hours of eleven and three o'clock.

Master of Trinity College; the Reverend William Chafy, D.D. Master of Sidney Sussex College; the Reverend George Thackeray, D.D. Provost of King's College; the Reverend William Webb, D.D. Master of Clare Hall; Mr. Serjeant Frere, LL. D. Master of Downing College; the Reverend George Archdall, B.D. Master of Emmanuel College; the Reverend Dr. Hollingworth, Norrisian Professor of Divinity, Member of the Caput; Dr. Geldart, the King's Professor of Civil Law, Member of the Caput; Dr. Paris, Representative of the Faculty of Medicine, Member of the Caput; the Reverend Christopher Wordsworth, Senior Regent, Member of the Caput; the Reverend Ralph Tatham, B. To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful subjects, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, humbly approach your Majesty's presence, with the assurance of our fervent and unalterable attachment to your Majesty's Royal Person and Government.

In seasons of political excitement, we do not ordinarily step forward to tender, at the foot of the Throne, any renewed assurance of our loyalty and devotion; but, at this particular juncture, we conceive ourselves especially and imperatively called upon, to give expression to the sentiments and feelings which the present aspect of public affairs has excited in our breasts.

With unfeigned sorrow and alarm, do we witness the efforts, which are now being made, to establish the principle, "that the revenues of the Protestant Church may be appropriated to other than ecclesiastical and Protestant purposes." The bare recognition of this principle, would be, in our deliberate judgment, most injurious to the best interests of religion; and, in its practical application, it must tend to the subversion of that glorious constitution, in Church and State, under which the British nation has enjoyed, for a long period, an increasing and unexampled

prosperity. Most anxiously, therefore, do we deprecate the adoption of such a principle.

Filled with these apprehensions for the safety of our truly Apostolic Church, we look earnestly, under Divine Providence, to your Majesty for protection; and encouraged by your Majesty's gracious disposition, and declared purpose, to maintain her integrity, we venture in all humility to assure your Majesty of our cordial and zealous co-operation in any measures, which, to your Majesty's wisdom, may appear best calculated to avert the impending danger.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following most gracious Answer:

"I receive with satisfaction, and rely with confidence upon the expression of your fervent and unalterable attachment to my Person and Government.

"Upon the great question to which your refer, I shall be anxious to receive the advice of my responsible Ministers, and of the great Council of the nation assembled in Parliament.

"I trust that the measures which they will recommend will be calculated to secure the safety of the Church and to avert any impending danger."

The Deputation was most graciously received, and had the honour to kiss His Majesty's hand.

St. James's-Palace, May 6, 1835.
