The Duke of Hano. ver, we are told, has begun his Journey for Italy, accompanied with one of the Princes his Sons; before his departure he fent a Gentleman to Vien-na with his Ratification of the Treaty he hath made with the Emperor for his Troops which are to be commanded by the Prince of Hanover, and under him by Monfieur Chauvet, Lieutenant-General of the Forces of the Duke of Zell. They write from Berlin, That the Elector of Brandenburg intends to passthe Winter at Postdam where an Envoy was arrived from the Elector of Saxony to complement the Electoral Prince and Princess upon their Marriage. There are Letters from Muscow which fay that the Prince Wasili Wasilowitz, the Czars chief Minister, had declared that the incursion which Cossacks and some Troops from Smolensko have lately made into Lithuania was without any order from the Czars, who though they had no reason to be very well satisfied with the Poles, yet would not give them any disturbance while they were engaged in a War against the Turks. The Princes of Lanenburg have defired the Elector of Brandenburg to grant the Troops they are to fend to the Emperors Assistance passage through his Territories. The Heer Van Hairen Ambassador from the States General of the United Provinces to the King of Sueden, is arrived at Wismar in a Suedish man of War which brought him from Stock bolme.
