deaconry shall be situate, or as to any archdeacon then existing within the diocese in which his archdeaconry was situate before the passing of the said Act, but subject to the same provisions as to licence for non-residence which are enacted with respect to incumbents of benefices by the Act relating to pluralities and the residence of the clergy, in the same Act mentioned :

“ And whereas the said archdeaconry of Norwich has no fixed endowment, and the average annual income thereof arising from fees and other emoluments does not exceed the sum of ninety-two pounds :

“ And whereas the Venerable John Bedingfield Collyer was, on the twenty-third day of September last, appointed, and now is Archdeacon of Norwich :

“ We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Norwich, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that the said archdeaconry of Norwich shall be endowed in the manner hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, that there shall be paid by us, to the said Venerable John Bedingfield Collyer, Archdeacon of Norwich, and his successors in the said archdeaconry, so long as they shall respectively hold the same, and shall duly reside in the diocese in which the same is or shall be situate, the annual sum of one hundred pounds, on the first day of January in every year; and every such whole yearly payment to such archdeacon shall be made only on production to us of a certificate, under the hand of the bishop for the time being of the diocese in which his archdeaconry is situate, that such archdeacon has duly resided during the preceding year, and a proportionate part of the first such yearly payment, calculated from the day of the date of his appointment to the first day of January last past, shall be forthwith paid to such archdeacon; and that whenever a vacancy in the said archdeaconry shall happen on any other day than the first day of January, the then next yearly payment shall be duly apportioned and paid between and to the archdeacon making the vacancy, or his representatives, and the archdeacon succeeding to the archdeaconry so becoming vacant.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any further or other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled “An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,” have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Frampton Cotterell and Westerleigh, both in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

“Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as thereafter provided:

“And whereas the said parishes of Frampton Cotterell and Westerleigh are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be together constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth:

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Frampton Cotterell, and also all that part of the said parish of Westerleigh, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof respectively, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “The District of Coalpit Heath.”

“And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds,

one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted, that it shall be lawful, by the authority aforesaid, at any time to assign the right of patronage of any such district or new parish as aforesaid, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof respectively, either in perpetuity, or for one or more nomination or nominations, to any ecclesiastical corporation, aggregate or sole, or to either of the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, or Durham, or to any college therein respectively, or to any person or persons, or the nominee or nominees of such person or persons or body respectively, upon condition of such corporation, university, college, person or persons contributing to the permanent endowment of such minister or perpetual curate, or towards providing a church or chapel for the use of the inhabitants of such district or new parish, in such proportion, and in such manner, as shall be approved by the like authority :

“ And whereas certain persons have contributed certain sums of money towards providing a church or chapel within the said district of Coalpit Heath, herein recommended to be constituted, and a church or chapel is now in course of erection, by the aid of such monies, within the said district, and is very nearly completed; and it has been agreed by such persons that such church or chapel, when completed, according to certain plans and a specification which have been submitted to us, shall be offered for approval by

us, for consecration, as the church or chapel of the said district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and we have satisfied ourselves that the said church or chapel, when so completed, will be fit to be so approved and consecrated :

“ And whereas the principal contributors towards the said church or chapel have, by an instrument in writing under their hands, nominated to us the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, for the time being, as the patron in perpetuity of the said district :

“ We, therefore, further recommend and propose, that the right of patronage of the said district, and, so soon as the same shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, the right of patronage of the church thereof, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate of such district or new parish, as the case may be, shall be wholly assigned to, and absolutely vested in, the said James Henry Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, and his successors Bishops of Gloucester and Bristol for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of COAL PIT HEATH, being

“ All that part of the parish of Westerleigh, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, situate on the western and north western side of an imaginary line commencing at the junction of the said parish of Westerleigh with the Bristol and Gloucester Railway at the Yate station (marked *a* on the map or plan herewith), in the same county and diocese; and thence extending, southward, along the western side of the said railway to the level crossing over the same (marked *b* as aforesaid); and thence, westward, in a direct line to the eastern angle (marked *c* as aforesaid) of a field belonging to the lords of the manor of Westerleigh, in the occupation of Charles Gibbs; and thence, westward, in a straight direction across the said field and the public road leading from Nibley to Rodford, to the eastern angle (marked *d* as aforesaid) of a field called Upper Rye Grass Ground, belonging to the

“And whereas the said parish of Radford is of great extent, and contains a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of such parish hereinafter mentioned and described, such part not at present containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Lincoln, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Radford described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “The District of New Radford.”

“And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate

for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of **NEW RADFORD**, being

“ All that part of the parish of Radford, in the county of Nottingham, and in the diocese of Lincoln, situate on the western side of an imaginary line, commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan herewith) on the northern boundary of the parish of Lenton, in the same county and diocese, opposite to the middle of Orchard-street; and thence extending northward along the middle of such street, as far as the middle of a certain footway leading from Old Radford to the town of Nottingham, on the north western side of an imaginary line extending towards the south east, from the northern extremity of the last-mentioned imaginary line, along the middle of the said footway and Denman-street, to a point (marked *b* as aforesaid) opposite to the middle of Baldwin-street; and on the south eastern side of an imaginary line extending towards the north

east, from such last-mentioned point, along the middle of an intended but unfinished street, as far as the boundary of the said parish of Radford.”

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron of the church of the parish out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted; and certain observations and objections offered by the said incumbent have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has, notwithstanding such observations and objections, been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct, that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled “ An Act to amend “ and render more effectual an Act, passed in “ the last session of Parliament, for building, and “ promoting the building, of additional churches “ in populous parishes,” duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words following, that is to say:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches, appointed by virtue of an Act, passed in the fifty-eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" continued by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to amend the Acts for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and further continued by an Act, passed in the first year of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to prolong, for ten years, Her Majesty's Commission for building new churches," beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the parish of Chiswick, in the county of Middlesex and diocese of London, it appears to them to be expedient, that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church or chapel, called Christ Church, at Turnham-green, in the said parish, under the provisions of the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes;" and that such district should be named, "The Chapelry District of Christ Church," and should consist of the north western part of the parish of Chiswick, with boundaries as follow :

"The district is bounded on the north and north west by the parishes of Acton and Ealing; on the south west by the river Thames; and on the south and east by the remaining part of the parish of Chiswick, from which it is separated by an imaginary line, proceeding from the river Thames in a south easterly direction, along the middle of the lane leading to Furzedown-place; it then turns north easterly, up the middle of the lane, and, passing Furzedown-place, proceeds in a straight line into the road from Sutton, up the middle of which road it proceeds in a northerly direction as far as the foot-path leading from Sutton to Chiswick, by the side of the Horticultural-gardens, and proceeding in an easterly direction, along that path, till it enters the Duke of Devon-

shire's private road, along the middle of which road it proceeds northerly, and enters the London road; it then turns eastwardly along the middle of the London-road as far as Fisher's-lane, up the middle of which lane it proceeds northerly to the point where the boundary of Chiswick and Acton parishes meet, as more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow:

"That banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings should be solemnized and performed in the said church called Christ Church; and that burials should also be performed, when a proper burial ground has been provided; and that the fees arising therefrom should be received by and belong to the present Vicar of Chiswick, during his incumbency of the vicarage of Chiswick; but, from and after his avoidance of the said vicarage, the said fees should be received by and belong to the Minister of the said church called Christ Church.

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this present instrument:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
