## PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with " certain modifications, the fourth report of the "Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and " Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act " to explain and amend two several Acts relating " to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of "Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues;" and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and "amend two several Acts relating to the Eccle-"siastical Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for ratifying a certain agreement made between us and the Prebendary of Givendale, in the cathedral church of York.

"Whereas it is by the said recited Acts enacted, that, for the purpose of fully carrying into effect the provisions thereof, any arrangement may from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the hand of any prebendary, for the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments in the possession or enjoyment of such prebendary, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments for any money payment, or of any money payment for any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments:

"And whereas, under other provisions and for the purposes of the said recited Acts, and chiefly for the purpose of making additional provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required, the whole property of the said prebend of Givendale will, upon the next vacancy thereof, become absolutely vested in us, and it is expedient to bring the same into earlier possession for such purposes; but the Venerable Charles Musgrave was, at the passing of the first-recited Act, and now is the prebendary thereof:

"And whereas, under the hereinbefore recited enactment, and by virtue of the general authority of the said recited Acts, we have entered into an agreement with the said prebendary, a copy whereof is annexed by way of schedule to this scheme; and the said agreement has been duly executed by the said Charles Musgrave:

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and propose, that the said agreement, and all acts, matters, and things done, and to be done, for carrying the same into effect, shall be valid and effectual in law, and binding upon the parties thereto, and upon all other persons whomsoever to all intents and purposes.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters herein contained, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"Articles of Agreement made this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, between the Venerable Charles Musgrave, Doctor of Divinity, Archdeacon of Craven, in the county of York, Vicar of Halifax, in the said county, and Prebendary of the prebend of Givendale, in the cathedral and metropolitical church of Saint Peter, of York aforesaid, lawfully founded, of the one part, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the other part.

"Whereas the said Charles Musgrave, in right of his prebend, is seized of or entitled to divers estates and hereditaments, which, or the greater part of which, have for many years been let on lease for lives at ancient rents, which leases have been usually renewed at certain periods, on payment to the said prebendary of fines or premiums as the consideration for granting such renewal, and according to such practice the lease next hereinafter recited would now have become renewable; and whereas, under and by virtue of a certain indenture of lease, bearing date the fifteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, made between the Reverend Henry Watkins, Clerk, M. A. Prebendary of the said prebend of Little Givendale, of the first part; William Bayldon, of Bootham, in the suburbs of the city of York, Gentleman, of the second part; and William Mills, John Robert Mills, and Joshua Mills, all of the said city of York, Gentlemen, of the third part; reciting, that the said William Bayldon, by his deed of surrender under his hand and seal, bearing date the day next before the day of the date of the now reciting indenture, had surrendered into the hands of the said Henry Watkins, to be cancelled, one indenture of lease of the hereditaments and premises hereinafter mentioned, bearing date on or about the seventeenth day of July one thousand seven hundred and ninety, and made and granted by the said Henry Watkins, as prebendary of the said prebend, for the natural lives of the Right Honourable Frederick Earl of Carlisle, the Right Honourable George Lord

Viscount Morpeth, eldest son of the said Frederick Earl of Carlisle, and the Honourable William Howard, second son of the said Frederick Earl of Carlisle, which said Frede ick Earl of Carlisle was since deceased, it was witnessed that, in consideration of the said surrender and divers other good causes and considerations him thereunto moving, he, the said Henry Watkins did, for himself and his successors, prebendaries of the said prebend, demise, grant, and to farm let unto the said William Bayldon, his heirs and assigns, all that the prebend and manor of Givendale Parva, alias Little Givendale, alias Little Geldall, with the rights, members, and appurtenances thereof, in the said county of York, and all messuages, lands, tenements, houses, edifices, buildings, barns, stables, tofts, crofts, curtilages, meadows, pastures, feedings, arable lands, commons, common of pasture, ways, easements, waters, watering places, paths, passages, free rents, rents of assize, and copyhold rents, courts, court leet, court baron, view of frankpledge, fines, amerciaments, perquisites, and profits of courts waifs, estrays, profits, commodities, and hereditaments whatsoever, within the said county of York, to the said prebend and manor belonging, or in anywise appertaining or accepted, reputed, deemed, letten, used, or enjoyed as part, parcel, or member thereof, situate, lying, and being within the said county of York; and also all and singular the royalties belonging unto Upper Poppleton, in the county of the city of York, so as the same extend no further than the county of York, and not into part or parcel of the said prebend being within the county of the city of York, saving unto the said royalties of Upper Poppleton, to hold the said prebend and manor, and the rights, members, and appurtenances thereof in the county of York, together with all and singular the royalties belonging to Upper Poppleton, in the county of the city of York as aforesaid, and all and singular the premises before mentioned and demised, with the appurtenances, unto the said William Bayldon, his heirs and assigns, for and during the natural lives of the Right Honourable George late Lord Viscount Morpeth, but then Earl of Carlisle, then aged fifty-two years, or thereabouts, the Honourable William Howard, brother of the said George Earl of Carlisle, aged forty-four years, or thereabouts,

and of Henry Strangwayes, aged eighteen years, or thereabouts, son of Richard Purchiss Strangwayes, of Murton, in the parish of Osbaldwick, in the county of York, Esquire, and for and during the life of the longest liver of them, under the yearly rent of six pounds, payable at the Feasts of Saint Martin the Bishop, in winter, and Pentecost; and whereas the said Henry Strangwayes, named in the said hereinbefore in part recited indenture of lease, died on or about the fifth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-two; and whereas the said William Howard, also named in the said lease, died in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three; and whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the authority of certain Acts of Parliament, enabling them in that behalf, have entered into an arrangement with the said Charles Musgrave, for the purchase or commutation of all his right and interest in the estates included in the hereinbefore recited indenture, at and for the gross sum of four thousand pounds:

" Now, therefore, in consideration of the sum of four thousand pounds of lawful money of Great Britain to the said Charles Musgrave in hand, paid by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, at or before the execution of this agreement, the receipt whereof the said Charles Musgrave doth hereby acknowledge, and of and from the same and every part thereof does acquit and discharge the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, their successors and assigns; he, the said Charles Musgrave, hereby undertakes and agrees, when requested so to do by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to convey, assign, surrender, and yield up unto the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, or to such persons or person, and by such deeds and assurances, and in such manner as the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall direct, all the estate, right, title, and interest whatsoever of him the said Charles Musgrave, from the day of the date hercof, of and in all and singular the hereditaments comprised in the said hereinbefore in part recited indenture of lease, freed and discharged of and from all rights, titles, interests, incumbrances, claims, or demands whatsoever, at any time heretofore, or to be hereafter made, created, suffered, or occasioned by the said Charles Musgrave.

other than and except the said hereinbefore in part recited indenture of lease; and also that he, the said Charles Musgrave, will, on the request of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, deliver over to them, or to any other person or persons they may appoint, all counterparts of leases, terriers, rentals, maps, plans, and all other documents whatsoever relating to or in any way affecting the said estates and hereditaments, or any of them which are now in his custody, possession, or power, or which he can or may procure without suit at law or in equity, and shall afford to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners all the information and assistance in his power, when required so to do, in order to their obtaining full knowledge respecting the said prebendal estates and the leases thereof; and the said Charles Musgrave hereby covenants and declares, that he hath not, since the fifteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, granted, and will not at any time hereafter grant, any renewed or other leases of any part of the said estates and hereditaments, and will not execute any grant or regrant of or admission to any copyhold or customary hereditaments, and will not receive any of the rents, tithes, rents charge, commutations, fines, fees, perquisites, pensions, portions, reliefs, heriots, or other sum or sums of money which shall, from the day of the date hereof, accrue, arise, or become due to him in right of his said prebend, nor exercise any other right of ownership, or other power or privilege whatsoever, in relation to the said premises; and it is hereby declared and agreed, that neither this agreement, nor any deed or instrument to be executed in pursuance thereof, shall operate to confirm or give effect to any lease heretofore granted, or expressed to be granted, of any part of the said prebendal estates which is or may be void or voidable, at law or in equity, or in any way affect the right of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and either in their own names, or in that of the said Charles Musgrave, to recover from any person or persons whomsoever compensation for any now present or future waste or dilapidations in the said estates and hereditaments, or any part thereof, but that the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall be at liberty to take any proceedings they may think fit for the purpose of setting aside any such lease, or on account of

any such waste or dilapidations as aforesaid, either during the life or continuance of the incumbency of the said Charles Musgrave, subject to the proviso next hereinafter contained, or after his death or determination of his incumbency, in like manner as if this agreement, or any such deed or instrument, had not been made or executed; provided always, that in case any proceedings shall be taken by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for setting aside any such lease, on account of any such waste or dilapidations as aforesaid, during the lifetime or incumbency of the said Charles Musgrave, they, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall indemnify and save harmless the said Charles Musgrave, his heirs, executors, and administrators, against all losses, costs, charges, and expences which he may pay or incur, or to which he may become liable in consequence thereof, either under any express or implied covenant, on his part, for the quiet enjoyment of the premises comprised in such lease, or otherwise; and the said Charles Musgrave doth hereby further undertake and agree, that the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and their successors, shall have full power and authority, by themselves or by any other person or persons, to be from time to time appointed by them, and at the costs and charges of the funds vested in them in virtue of their said office, to use the name and act as the attorney of the said Charles Musgrave in asking, demanding, suing for, recovering, or receiving and giving receipts for the said rents, tithes, rents charge, commutations for tithes, fines, fees, perquisites, pensions, portions, reliefs, heriots, or other sum and sums of money, and settling and adjusting all accounts, matters, and things relating thereto, and also for setting aside any lease or leases heretofore granted, or expressed to be granted, of any part or parts of the said estates and hereditaments, and recovering possession of the same estates and hereditaments, or in any proceedings, either in law or in equity, relating to any waste or dilapidations as aforesaid; provided always, that nothing herein contained shall alter or affect the right or interest of the said Charles Musgrave in or to any advowson or rights of patronage or presentation belonging to him in right of his said prebend; and, lastly, it is hereby agreed by the the said Charles Musgrave, and by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the costs,

charges, and expences of and relating to the arrangement between the said Charles Musgrave and the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to this agreement, shall be borne by the said Charles Musgrave and the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in equal proportions; and that the costs of all deeds and assurances for conveying or assuring the said estates and premises to, or in trust for, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall be paid by them: in witness whereof the said Charles Musgrave hath hereunto set his hand and seal, and the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have hereunto affixed their common seal, the day and year first above written."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.
