**N**OTICE is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Birth-day will be celebrated on Tuesday the 9th of June next.

**A**T the Court at *Buckingham-Palace*, the 6th day of *April* 1846,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parishes of Saint Helier, Saint Saviour, and Saint Clement, all in the island of Jersey, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas it is by the said Act enacted, that if at any time it shall be made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that any part or parts of any parish or parishes, chapelry or chapelries, district or districts, of great extent, and containing a large population, and wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, or any extra-parochial place or places, or any part or parts thereof, should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, it shall be lawful, by the authority in the same Act provided (that is to say, by a scheme prepared by us, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council, ratifying such scheme), with the consent of the bishop of the diocese, under his hand and seal, to set out by metes and bounds, and constitute a separate district accordingly, such district not then containing within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, and to fix and declare the name of such district; and it is by the same Act provided, that the draft of any scheme for constituting any such district shall be delivered or transmitted to the incumbent and to the patron or patrons of the church or chapel of any parish, chapelry, or district, out of which it is recommended that any such district, or any part thereof, should be taken, in order that such incumbent, patron or patrons, may have an opportunity of offering or making to us, or to such bishop, any observations or objections upon or to the constituting of such district; and that such scheme shall not be laid before your Majesty in Council until

after the expiration of one calendar month next after such copy shall have been so delivered or transmitted, unless such incumbent and patron or patrons shall, in the meantime, consent to the same; and it is by the same Act also provided, that in every such scheme for constituting any such district we shall recommend to your Majesty in Council, that the minister of such district, when duly licensed according to the same Act, shall be permanently endowed, under the provisions of the same Act, to an amount of not less than the annual value of one hundred pounds; and also, if such endowment be of less than the annual value of one hundred and fifty pounds, that the same shall be increased to such last-mentioned amount at the least, so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as hereinafter provided :

“ And whereas the said parishes of Saint Helier, Saint Saviour, and Saint Clement are respectively of great extent, and contain a large population, and the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence therein is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof; and it has been made to appear to us, that it would promote the interests of religion, that the particular part of each of such parishes hereinafter mentioned and described, neither of which parts at present contains within its limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship, should together be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth :

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard Bishop of Winchester, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that all that part of the said parish of Saint Helier, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Saviour, and also all that part of the said parish of Saint Clement, described in the schedule hereunto annexed,—all which parts, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto also annexed,—shall be together constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes accordingly; and that the same shall be named, “ The District of Saint Luke, Jersey.”

“ And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the said Act, the sum of one hundred pounds; and upon any building within such district, being duly licensed by the bishop of the diocese for the performance of divine service, according to the same Act, there shall be paid by us, in like manner, to such minister, the further sum of thirty pounds, making in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds; and that so soon as any church or chapel within such district shall have been duly approved by us, and consecrated as the church or chapel of such district, for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon

become, according to the provisions of the same Act, a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes, there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the perpetual curate for the time being of such new parish, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds; and that the said sum of one hundred pounds, one hundred and thirty pounds, or one hundred and fifty pounds, as the case may be, shall be paid, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister or of such building, or of the consecration of such church or chapel as aforesaid, as the case may be; and that in case a vacancy in the ministry or perpetual curacy of such district or new parish shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister or the perpetual curate making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister or the perpetual curate succeeding to such district or new parish.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

#### “ SCHEDULE.

“ The district of SAINT LUKE, JERSEY, being—

“ All that part of the parish of Saint Helier, and also all that part of the parish of Saint Saviour, and also all that part of the parish of Saint Clement, all in the island of Jersey, and in the diocese of Winchester, together bounded as follows, that is to say; on the southern side thereof by the sea coast, and on all other sides thereof by an imaginary line commencing at a point (marked *a* on the map or plan hereunto annexed) on the sea shore, near the Engineer Barracks, and opposite to the middle of the road leading from Harvre des Pas, and thence extending, first towards the north west, along the middle of such road, as far as the middle of East-road, and thence first toward the north east, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, and of Regent-road, and the road called La Chasse, as far as the middle of Colomberie-road, and thence eastward, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, and of Bagatelle-road or Rouge-rue, and Ellison's-road as far as the middle of Belvedere-road at the upper end of Elizabeth-place, and thence southward, along the middle of such road as far as the middle of the road called Ruettepaveé, and thence eastward, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, and across the Grouville-road, as far as the middle of Aubin's-lane, and thence towards the south east, along the middle of such last-mentioned lane and Flat

brook-lané, as far as the middle of the road called La Grand Charière, and thence towards the south west, along the middle of such last-mentioned road, as far as the sea shore aforesaid."

And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the patron of the churches of the parishes out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, and to the incumbents of the churches of two of such parishes, that is to say, the parishes of Saint Clement and Saint Helier, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act; and such draft has also been transmitted to the curate duly appointed to the church of the other of such parishes, that is to say, the parish of Saint Saviour, in conformity with the provisions of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend "an Act for making better provision for the "spiritual care of populous parishes;" and whereas one calendar month has expired since such draft was so transmitted:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for granting to Her Majesty, "for a term to be limited, certain duties on sugar "imported into the United Kingdom," it was enacted, that from and after the fourteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, there should be charged, amongst other duties of Customs, the following (that is to say):

On sugar the growth and produce of China, Java, or Manilla, or of any foreign country the sugars of which Her Majesty in Council should have declared, or might thereafter declare, to be admissible as not being the produce of slave

labour, and which should be imported into the United Kingdom, either from the country of its growth or from some British possession, having first been imported into such British possession from the country of its growth, the duties following (that is to say):

White-clayed sugar, or sugar rendered by any process equal in quality to white-clayed, not being refined, for every hundred weight . . . . . 1 3 0

Brown sugar, being Muscovado or clayed, or any other sugar, not being equal in quality to white-clayed, for every hundred weight 1 3 4

and so in proportion for any greater or less quantity than a hundred weight:

And by the said Act it was also enacted, that with regard to sugar the growth of any foreign country between which country and Her Majesty there was then subsisting any Treaty or Convention binding Her Majesty to grant to such country, either conditionally or unconditionally, the privileges of the most favoured nation, or to permit, either conditionally or unconditionally, the produce of such country to be imported into the United Kingdom at the same duties as are imposed upon the like produce of any country, it should be lawful for Her Majesty, from time to time, by any Order or Orders in Council, to declare that, from and after a day to be named in such Order, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of such country, in case such Treaty should continue to subsist, should, if imported from such country, or from any British possession abroad, having been imported into such British possession from such country, be admitted to entry for consumption in the United Kingdom, at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings, and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively, in like manner as sugars the growth and produce of China, Java, or Manilla:

And whereas a Treaty was, on the eighteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, concluded between His late Majesty King George the Fourth and the State of Colombia, containing, among other things, an agreement, that no higher or other duties should be imposed on the importation into the territories of His Britannic Majesty of any articles of the growth, produce, or manufacture of Colombia than were or should be payable on the like articles, being the growth, produce, or manufacture of any other foreign country:

And whereas the Republic of New Granada was, at the time of the conclusion of the said Treaty, a part of the said State of Colombia:

And whereas the said Treaty was, at the time of the passing of the said Act, and still is subsisting between Her Majesty and the said Republic of New Granada, as having so been a part of the said State of Colombia as aforesaid:

And whereas application has been made on the part of the Government of the said Republic of New Granada, claiming under the said Treaty the admission of sugars, the growth of the dominions of the said Republic, at the said respective duties of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that, from and after the first day of May next ensuing the date hereof, brown, Muscovado, or clayed sugars (not being refined), the growth of the dominions of the said Republic of New Granada, shall, if imported from the dominions of the said Republic, or from any British possession abroad, having been imported into such British possession from the said dominions, be admitted to entry for consumption into the United Kingdom at the aforesaid respective rates of duty of one pound eight shillings and one pound three shillings and four pence per hundred weight, respectively; subject, nevertheless, to the production of the like certificates, and the making of the like declaration, as are in the said Act required, with respect to sugars the growth of China, Java, or Manilla:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising the sum of eighteen millions three hundred and eighty thousand two hundred pounds, by Exchequer Bills, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

An Act to indemnify such persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for offices and employments, and to extend the time limited for those purposes, respectively, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.

An Act to continue, until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and from thence to the end of the then next session of Parliament, the several Acts relating to insolvent debtors in India.

An Act to authorize the Inclosure of certain lands, in pursuance of the recommendation of the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales.

An Act for the abolition of the exclusive privilege of trading in burghs in Scotland.

An Act to amend and enlarge some of the provisions of the Acts relating to the Great Western Railway Company, and to confirm the purchase of certain railways by the said company.

An Act for altering, amending, and enlarging the powers and provisions of the several Acts passed in relation to the Monkland Navigation.

An Act to enable the United Company of Proprietors of the Ellesmere and Chester Canal to raise a further sum of money.

An Act for improving and maintaining the port and harbour of Helensburgh, in the county of Dumbarton.

An Act for constructing a wet dock and other works on the south side of the river Wear, at Sunderland near the Sea, in the county palatine of Durham.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Manchester and Salford Water Works to raise a further sum of money.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the Glasgow Water Works to introduce an additional supply of water to the city and suburbs of Glasgow.

An Act for better supplying with water the city and neighbourhood of York.

An Act for better supplying with water the town and environs of Boston, in the county of Lincoln.

An Act for establishing a cemetery at Birmingham, in the county of Warwick.

An Act for granting more effectual powers for fighting with gas the town of Bury, and the neighbourhood thereof, in the parish of Bury, in the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for lighting with gas the town of Middleton and its vicinity, in the county of Lancaster.
