The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act

"to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for substituting a money payment to the Prebendary of the prebend of Hoxton, in the cathedral church of Saint Paul, London, for certain property belonging to him as such Prebendary.

"Whereas, under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the property belonging to any prebend not residentiary in any cathedral church in England (excepting any right of patronage), becomes, upon the first avoidance of such prebend, absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts; and the chief of such purposes is that of making better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it is by the same Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may, from

time to time, be made, with the consent in writing, under the hand of any prebendary of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer or exchange of any lands, tithes or other hereditaments belonging to such prebendary, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes or hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any lands, tithes or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes or other hereditaments :

“ And whereas the property now belonging to the prebend of Hoxton, in the cathedral church of Saint Paul, London, consists, among other things, of certain lands, tenements and other hereditaments in the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, in the county of Middlesex :

“ And whereas it was, on the second day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, agreed between us and the Right Reverend Edward Bishop of Llandaff, the present Prebendary of the said prebend of Hoxton, that the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council, with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purpose of the said Acts hereinbefore particularly mentioned :

“ We, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Bishop of Llandaff, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and after the day of such gazetting, all lands, tenements and hereditaments (except any right of patronage), now belonging to or forming part of the endowment of the said prebend of Hoxton, or to or in which he the said Edward Bishop of Llandaff, as such prebendary, has, or ought to have, any right, title or interest, shall, together with all such right, title and interest therein, be and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed, by and from the said Edward Bishop of Llandaff to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, and that in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance as aforesaid, there shall be paid by us to the said Edward Bishop of Llandaff, in each and every year so long as he shall continue to hold the said prebend of Hoxton and no longer,

the annual sum of one hundred and twenty-seven pounds, by equal half-yearly payments, on the second day of June and the second day of December, the first such payment being made on the second day of June next; provided, that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease, of any part of such lands, tenements and hereditaments as aforesaid, shall, since the said second day of December last, have been or shall be granted by the said Edward Bishop of Llandaff; and that, if the next avoidance of the said prebend shall happen on any other day than one of such two half-yearly days of payment, then a proportionate sum only shall be paid to the said Edward Bishop of Llandaff, or his representative or representatives.

“ And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters herein contained, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or either of them.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the fourth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled “ An Act concerning banns and marriages in certain district churches or chapels,” duly prepared

and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eleventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, by virtue of an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and forty, a particular district, under the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," was, by such Order in Council, and in conformity with the provisions contained in the said section, duly assigned to the church of Saint Philip, situate in the district parish of Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, in the county of Middlesex, and within the diocese of London :

"That the said Order in Council did not direct that marriages should be performed in the said church :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave to represent to your Majesty, that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the said district so assigned to the said church of Saint Philip, it appears to them to be expedient, that banns of marriage should hereafter be published, and that marriages should hereafter be solemnized and performed in the said church of Saint Philip, and that a supplemental Order for such purpose should be made, pursuant to the provisions of the fourth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eight years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act concerning banns and marriages in certain district churches or chapels;" and that one moiety of the fees to arise from the publication of banns or the solemnization or performance of marriages in such church should belong to the Incumbent thereof for the time being; and that the other moiety of such fees should be received for, on account of, and paid to the present Incumbent of the said district parish of Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, during his incumbency thereof, but upon his resigning or otherwise avoiding such incumbency, that the whole of the

said fees should belong to the said Incumbent of the said church of Saint Philip for the time being :

"That the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Lord Bishop of London, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section lastly hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles James Lord Bishop of London has signed and sealed this representation :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.

The following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland having been transmitted by Robert Montgomery Lord Belhaven, Her Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart. one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the Queen; which Address Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously :

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in this General Assembly, have received with gratitude the gracious letter in which your Majesty has been pleased to convey to us the expression of your cordial approbation of the present meeting of our Assembly, and to renew the assurance of your royal countenance and support, and of the affectionate regard which you bear towards the Church of Scotland. It is our earnest desire and prayer that the blessing of Almighty God may enable us to conduct all our proceedings with that wisdom and prudence which become a Christian Assembly, and which will at once secure your Majesty's approbation and promote the spiritual welfare of the people committed to our charge.

We can assure your Majesty of our steadfast loyalty, and of our earnest purpose to do all that in us lies to justify your Majesty's confidence in our discretion and forbearance, by maintaining unity amongst ourselves and peace and good order amongst all ranks of society wherever our influence extends.

Cordially participating in your Majesty's feeling of deep concern on account of the sufferings and privations with which it has pleased Divine Providence of late to visit a large portion of the inhabitants of this country, we rejoice that these sufferings have hitherto been borne with exemplary patience, and that, through the generous contributions of all classes in the community, much has been done to mitigate them. We can assure your Majesty, that no effort of ours shall be wanting, whether in the way of public admonition or otherwise, to provide a remedy for these privations which so large a portion of the land is at present afflicted.

It is regarded by us as a special token of your Majesty's favour towards our National Church, that the high honour of representing your Royal Person in this Assembly has again been conferred on the Right Honourable Lord Belhaven, a Nobleman who, both on account of his personal qualities and as a tried and honoured Member and Office-bearer of the Church of Scotland, possesses our fullest confidence and respect.

We tender our best thanks for your Majesty's renewed gift of two thousand pounds for the promotion of religion in the Highland and Islands of Scotland, and we pledge ourselves to adopt those measures which to our judgment shall appear the best fitted to accomplish the important purposes to which your royal bounty has been destined.

That the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ may bless your Majesty, your Royal Consort, the Prince of Wales, and all your Royal House; that your reign may be distinguished by peace, prosperity, social improvement, and, above all, by the righteousness which exalteth a nation; and that, after a long and glorious reign on earth, you may be received into the eternal blessedness of the Kingdom of God, is the earnest prayer of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, loyal, and dutiful subjects, the Ministers and Elders, convened in this General Assembly, of the Church of Scotland.

Admiralty, 1st June 1847.

HER Majesty having been graciously pleased to command, that a medal should be struck to record the services of Her Fleets and Armies, during the wars commencing in 1793 and ending in 1815, and that one should be conferred on every Officer, Non-commissioned Officer, Petty Officer, Soldier, Seaman, and Marine, who was present in any action, naval or military, to commemorate which medals have been struck by command of Her Majesty's Royal Predecessors, and distributed to Superior Officers, according to the rules of the Service at that time in force.

All Officers, Petty Officers, Seamen, and Marines, who consider that they are entitled to receive this mark of their Sovereign's gracious recollection of their services, and of Her desire to record the same, are to send, in writing, the statement of their claims, addressed to the Secretary of the Admiralty, Whitehall, London, specifying for what action, and at what period of time, the claim is preferred, and the names of the persons or the titles of the documents by which it can be established.

A Board of Officers will be appointed to take into consideration the facts stated in these applications, and to report upon the same to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, for the information of Her Majesty, so as to enable those commanded by Her Majesty to deliver to the claimants the medals accordingly.

The names of all those, who may apply for the naval medal, will be classed alphabetically, and to each name will be appended the actions at which the claimant may have been present, proof of which must be given to the entire satisfaction of the Board.

The occasions for which medals have been granted by the Sovereign are specified below, for general information and guidance.
