Buckingham-Palace, July 23, 1847.

THIS day Her Majesty, accompanied by His Royal Highness Prince Albert, proceeded in state from Buckingham-Palace to the House of Peers, where she arrived soon after two o'clock; and was received, on alighting from her state coach, by the Lord Chancellor, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Lord Steward of the Household, the Duke of Wellington, Garter King of Arms, and Black Rod, and proceeded to the robing-room in the customary manner.

Her Majesty was there robed, and the procession moved into the House in the usual order;—the sword of state was borne by the Duke of Wellington, the cap of maintenance by the Marquess of Winchester, and the crown by the Marquess of Lansdowne.

Her Majesty being seated on the Throne, and His Royal Highness Prince Albert on a Chair on the left side of the Cloth of Estate, the Great Officers of State and others standing on the right and left, Sir Augustus Clifford, Bart. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a message from Her Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither ac-

cordingly, Her Majesty was pleased to deliver the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I HAVE much satisfaction in being able to release you from the duties of a laborious and anxious session. I cannot take leave of you without expressing my grateful sense of the assiduity and zeal with which you have applied yourselves to the consideration of the public interests.

Your attention has been principally directed to the measures of immediate relief which a great and unprecedented calamity rendered necessary.

I have given my cheerful assent to those laws which, by allowing the free admission of grain, and by affording facilities for the use of sugar in breweries and distilleries, tend to increase the quantity of human food, and to promote commercial intercourse.

I rejoice to find that you have in no instance proposed new restrictions, or interfered with the liberty of foreign or internal trade, as a mode of relieving distress. I feel assured that such measures are generally ineffectual, and in some cases aggravate the evils for the alleviation of which they are adopted.

I cordially approve of the acts of large and liberal bounty by which you have assuaged the sufferings of my Irish subjects. I have also readily given my sanction to a law to make better provision for the permanent relief of the destitute in Ireland. I have likewise given my assent to various Bills calculated to promote the agriculture and develop the industry of that portion of the United Kingdom. My attention shall be directed to such further measures as may be conducive to those salutary purposes.

My relations with foreign powers continue to inspire me with confidence in the maintenance of peace.

It has afforded me great satisfaction to find that the measures which, in concert with the King of the French, the Queen of Spain, and the Queen of Portugal, I have taken for the pacification of Portugal, have been attended with success, and that the civil war which for many months had afflicted that country has at last been brought to a bloodless termination.

I indulge the hope that future differences between political parties in that country may be settled without an appeal to arms.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I thank you for your willingness in granting me the necessary supplies; they shall be applied with due care and economy to the public service.

I am happy to inform you, that, notwithstanding the high price of food, the revenue has, up to the present time, been more productive than I had reason to anticipate. The increased use of articles of general consumption has chiefly contributed to this result. The revenue derived from sugar, especially, has been greatly augmented by the removal of the prohibitory duties on foreign sugar.

The various grants which you have made for education in the United Kingdom will, I trust, be conducive to the religious and moral improvement of my people.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I think proper to inform you, that it is my intention immediately to dissolve the present Parliament.

I rely with confidence on the loyalty to the Throne and attachment to the free institutions of this country which animate the great body of my

people. I join with them in supplications to Almighty God, that the dearth by which we have been afflicted may, by the Divine blessing, be converted into cheapness and plenty.

Then the Lord Chancellor, by Mer Majesty's command, said,

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

It is Her Majesty's royal will and pleasure, that this Parliament be prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-first day of September next, to be then here holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-first day of September next.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain "modifications, the fourth report of the Commiss" sioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect, with certain modifications, "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ec-"clesiastical Duties and Revenues," have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme, for augmenting the income of the Perpetual Curate of Saint Thomas, Charterhouse, by further apportioning the income of the Rector of Saint Catharine Coleman, in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it was by the said Act enacted, that arrangements might be made, by the authority therein provided, for the apportionment of the income of two benefices belonging to the same patron, between the incumbents or ministers of such benefices, or the churches or chapels connected therewith, provided that no such arrangement should be made, in any case, so as to prejudice the interests of any existing incumbent, nor without the consent of the bishop of the diocese:

"And whereas the Bishop of London, for the time being, is patron of the rectory of Saint Catharine Coleman, which is now vacant, and of the perpetual curacy of Saint Thomas, Charterhouse, and both the said benefices are in the said diocese of London:

"And whereas, by an Order of your Majesty in Council, duly made and gazetted, and bearing date the twentieth day of May last, ratifying a scheme prepared by us under the said recited enactment, the income of the said rectory of Saint Catharine Coleman was apportioned in the manner therein mentioned, and the said income was thereby reduced to the average annual sum of seven hundred pounds:

"And whereas the average annual income of the said perpetual curacy of Saint Thomas, Charterhouse, is one hundred and fifty pounds, and the population thereof exceeds eight thousand:

"And whereas a desire has been expressed to us by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop of London, that arrangements should be made for further apportioning the income of the said rectory in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the said Charles James Bishop of London, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme, that there shall hereafter be paid by the rector, for the time being, of the said rectory of Saint Catharine Coleman, out of the revenues of the said rectory, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year, to the perpetual curate, for the time being, of the said perpetual curacy of Saint Thomas, Charterhouse, the clear annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, the first such half-yearly payment being made on the first day of January next; and that the said annual sum, and each and every instalment thereof, shall be hereby charged upon the said revenues, and upon all the glebe lands,

tithes, rent charges, dues, profits and emoluments whatsoever which of right do, shall or may belong to the said rectory, or to the rector thereof, for the time being, as such rector; and that if any vacancy in the said perpetual curacy shall happen on any other day than the first day of January or the first day of July, the then next half-yearly payment shall be apportioned between and paid to the perpetual curate making such vacancy, or his personal representatives, and the succeeding perpetual curate.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

HEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to further amend the Church Building "Acts," and of the sixteenth section of another Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an "Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for

" building, and promoting the building, of ad-

"ditional churches in populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of July one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in the words following, viz.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that, on the sixteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fortytwo, your Majesty's said Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon, made a representation to your Majesty in Council, that it was expedient that particular districts should be assigned to the consecrated churches of Saint James, at Heckmondwike, and Saint John, at Cleckheaton, and the church at Birkenshaw, all of which are situate in the parish of Birstall, in the west riding of the county of York, and within the diocese of Ripon, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to " amend and render more effectual an Act, " passed in the last session of Parliament, for " building, and promoting the building, of ad-" ditional churches in populous parishes," and that the district so to be assigned to the said church of Saint John, at Cleekheaton, should be named, " The Chapelry District of Saint John, Cleckheaton," and with boundaries as set forth in such representation and hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

"The chapelry district of Saint John, Cleck-beaton, consists of the hamlet of Cleckheaton, which is bounded on the north by the hamlet of Oakenshaw, in the township of Cleckheaton; on or towards the east by the townships of Huns-worth and Gomersal; on the south by the township of Liversedge; on the west by the hamlet of Scholes, in the township of Cleckheaton, all the above being in the parish of Birstall, as such district was more particularly delineated on a map or plan annexed to the said representation, and thereon coloured red:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twentyseventh of April one thousand eight hundred and

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forty-two, your Majesty was graciously pleased, by and with the advice of your Privy Council, to approve of the assignment of such districts respectively, and was pleased to order that the same should be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that a description of the boundaries of the said districts was duly enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery, on or about the sixteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty-two:

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that, having taken into consideration the present circumstances of the said parish of Birstall and of the said district which was so assigned to the church of Saint John, at Clecheaton, it appears to them to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said district should be altered, under or by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to: "further amend the Church Building Acts," and that the boundaries hereinafter set forth should be substituted for those comprised in the said Order in Council, bearing date the twenty-seventh of April one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, that is to say:

" The boundary of the chapelry district of Cleckheaton commences at the crown or centre of Hunsworth-bridge, and following the course of the stream proceeds in a south easterly directions till it meets another stream, which separates the township of Hunsworth from the township of Gomersal; it then proceeds in a north easterly direction, up the said last-mentioned stream, till it arrives at the boundary of the district of Gomersal, which boundary it follows till it arrives: at the rivulet which separates the township of Cleckheaton from the township of Liversedge, and from thence proceeds in a straight line to the centre of a boundary post placed on the easterns side of Pinet-hall-lane, and at a distance of three hundred and thirty-seven yards, or thereabouts, from the centre of the bridge, at the northern extremity of the said lane, and continues in a straight direction to the western boundary of Quaker-lane; it then proceeds northerly down such lane to the

aforesaid rivulet, which is the boundary of the townships of Cleckheaton and Liversedge; and then follows the said rivulet, in a westerly direction, till it arrives at the point where the first or more easterly of the two streams which cross the Leeds and Elland turnpike road, at Moor. Bottom, meets the said rivulet, and then proceeds in a straight line to the crown or centre of Hunsworth-bridge aforesaid, where the district commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured red:

" Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it appears to them to be also expedient, that banns of marriage should be published, or continue to be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed, or continue to be solemnized or performed, in the said church of Saint John, at Cleckheaton aforesaid; and that the fees arising therefrom should be equally divided between the Incumbent of such church for the time being and the Vicar of the said parish of Birstall for the time being:

"That the consents of the said Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon, as Bishop of the diocese, and as the patron of the parish church of Birstall aforesaid, and of the Reverend William Margetson Heald, as the Vicar or Incumbent of such parish church, have been severally obtained to such proposed alteration of boundaries as aforesaid, as required by the sixth section of the Act lastly hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon and William Margetson Heald have respectively signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave also to represent, that, having taken into further consideration all the circumstances of the said parish of Birstall, it appears to them to be also expedient, that particular districts should be assigned to three other consecrated churches in the said parish, namely, to All Saints' Church at Robert-town, to the old church or chapel at Drighlington, and to the old church or chapel at Whitechapel, under and by virtue of the power or authority for such purpose contained in the sixteenth section of the said Act, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty

King George the Third, or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority enabling your Majesty's said Commissioners in this behalf, and that such districts should be severally named, "The Chapelry District of Robert-town," "The Chapelry District of Drighlington," and "The Chapelry District of Whitechapel," and that the boundaries of such districts should be as follow, that is to say:

"The boundary of the chapelry district of Robert-town commences at the point where the township of Heckmondwike and the hamlets of Little-town and Robert-town severally meet, from which point it proceeds in a straight line south westerly to the point where the West Riding Union Railway crosses the Leeds and Huddersfield turnpike road; it then follows the said railway in a westerly. direction till it arrives at the boundary of the hamlet of Robert-town, which boundary it follows: in a south westerly direction as far as the boundary line which separates the parish of Birstall from the township of Hartishead-cum-Clifton, in the detached part of the parish of Dewsbury, and then follows such boundary south easterly untik it meets the boundary of the parish of Mirfield, and then continues along the boundary line separating the parishes of Birstall and Mirfield till they meet the parish of Dewsbury, and then follows the boundary line separating the parish of Birstall from that of Dewsbury as far as the point where the boundary of the townships of Liversedge and Heckmondwike meet at the said parish of Dewsbury, and then follows such boundary north westerly till it arrives at the point where the district commenced, as the same is more particularly delineated on the said map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue:

"The boundaries of the chapelry district of Drighlington are the ancient and well known boundaries of the township of Drighlington, and are more particularly delineated on the said map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured brown:

"The chapelry district of Whitechapel is toconsist of the hamlets of Oakenshaw and Scholes, and that portion of the hamlet of Cleckheatom which is not included in Saint John's district, Cleckheaton, and is bounded as follows, namely, on the north east by the township of Hunsworth, as far as Hunsworth-bridge; on the east by a line drawn in a southerly direction from Hunsworthbridge to the stream which crosses the Leeds and | Board of Elland turnpike road at Moor Bottom (and which line forms the western boundary of Saint John's district, Cleckheaton), and from such stream follows the boundary of the hamlets of Hightown and Scholes, as far as the township of Hartisheadcum-Clifton, in the the said detached part of the said parish of Dewsbury; on the south by the said township of Hartishead-cum-Clifton, in the said detached part of the said parish of Dewsbury; on the west by the district of Wyke; and on the north by the parish of Bradford, as the said chapelry district of Whitechapel is more particularly delineated on the said map hereunto annezed, and thereon coloured yellow:

" That banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said churches at Robert-town, Drighlington, and Whitechapel; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be equally divided between the respective Incumbents for the time being of such churches and the Vicar of the said parish of Birstall for the time being:

" That the consent of the said Charles Thomas Lord Bishop of Ripon, as Bishop of the diocese, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Act and section lastly hereinbefore mentioned; in testimony whereof, the said Charles Thomas Bishop of Ripon has signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners, therefore, humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty, having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed alteration of boundaries and assignment of chapelry districts be accordingly made; and the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.
