Buckingham-Palace, February 4, 1851.

THIS day Her Majesty, accompanied by His Royal Highness Prince Albert, proceeded in state from Buckingham-Palace to the House of Peers, where she arrived soon after two o'clock: and was received, on alighting from her state coach, by the Lord Chancellor, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, Sir Augustus Clifford, Bart. C.B. Deputy Great Chamberlain, (in the absence of the Lord Willoughby de Eresby), the Lord Steward of the Household, the Duke of Wellington, Garter King of Arms, and the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, and proceeded to the robing-room in the customary manner.

Her Majesty was there robed, and the procession moved into the House in the usual order;—the sword of state was borne by the Duke of Wellington, the cap of maintenance by the Marquess of Winchester, and the crown by

the Marquess of Lansdowne.

Her Majesty being seated on the Throne, and His Royal Highness Prince Albert on a Chair on the left side of the Cloth of Estate, the Great Officers of State and others standing on the right and left, James Pulman, Esquire, Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a message from Her Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, Her Majesty was pleased to deliver the following most gracious Speech to both Houses of Parliament:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

IT is with great satisfaction that I again meet my Parliament, and resort to your advice and assistance in the consideration of measures which

affect the welfare of our country.

I continue to maintain the relations of peace and amity with foreign powers. It has been my endeavour to induce the states of Germany to carry into full effect the provisions of the Treaty with Denmark, which was concluded at Berlin in the month of July of last year. I am much gratified in being able to inform you that the German Confederation and the government of Denmark are now engaged in fulfilling the stipulations of that Treaty, and thereby putting an end to hostilities which at one time appeared full of danger to the peace of Europe.

I trust that the affairs of Germany may be arranged by mutual agreement in such a manner as to preserve the strength of the Confederation and to maintain the freedom of its separate states.

I have concluded with the King of Sardinia Articles additional to the Treaty of September 1841, and I have directed that those Articles shall be laid before you.

The government of Brazil has taken new, and, I hope, efficient, measures for the suppression of the atrocious traffic in slaves.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I have directed the estimates of the year to be prepared and laid before you without delay. They have been framed with a due regard to economy and to the necessities of the public service.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

Notwithstanding the large reductions of taxation which have been effected in late years, the receipts of the revenue have been satisfactory.

The state of the commerce and manufactures of the United Kingdom has been such as to afford

general employment to the labouring classes.

I have to lament, however, the difficulties which are still felt by that important body among my people who are owners and occupiers of land.

But it is my confident hope that the prosperous condition of other classes of my subjects will have a favourable effect in diminishing those difficulties, and promoting the interests of agriculture.

The recent assumption of certain ecclesiastical titles conferred by a foreign power has excited strong feelings in this country, and large bodies of my subjects have presented addresses to me, expressing attachment to the throne, and praying that such assumptions should be resisted. I have assured them of my resolution to maintain the rights of my crown, and the independence of the nation, against all encroachment, from whatever quarter it may proceed. I have at the same time expressed my earnest desire and firm determination, under God's blessing, to maintain unimpaired the religious liberty which is so justly prized by the people of this country.

It will be for you to consider the measure which will be laid before you on this subject.

The administration of justice in the several departments of law and equity will, no doubt, receive the serious attention of Parliament; and I feel confident that the measures which may be submitted to you with a view of improving that administration will be discussed with that mature deliberation which important changes in the highest courts of judicature in the kingdom imperatively demand.

A measure will be laid before you providing for the establishment of a system of registration of deeds and instruments relating to the transfer of property. This measure is the result of inquiries which I have caused to be made into the practicability of adopting a system of registration calculated to give security to titles, to diminish the causes of litigation to which they have hitherto been liable, and to reduce the cost of transfers.

To comblifie the progress of improvement with the stability of our institutions will, I am confident, be your constant care. We may esteem ourselves fortunate that we can pursue without disturbance the course of calm and peaceable amelioration; and we have every cause to be thankful to Almighty God for the measure of tranquillity and happiness which has been youchsafed to us.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend an "Act for the regulation of Municipal Corporations "in England and Wales," it is amongst other things enacted, that if the inhabitant householders of any town or borough in England or Wales shall petition Her Majesty to grant to them a charter of incorporation, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by any such charter, if she shall think fit, by the advice of Her Privy Council, to grant the same, to extend to the inhabitants of any such town or borough within the district to be set forth in such charter, all the powers and provisions of the Act of the fifth and sixth of William the Fourth, cap. 76, for regulating corporations, whether such town or borough be or be not a corporate town or borough, or be or be not named in either of the schedules to the said Act: Provided, nevertheless, that notice of every such petition, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by Her Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette one month at least before such petition shall be so considered:

And whereas the inhabitant householders of the borough of Blackburne, in the county of Lancaster, have presented a petition to Her Majesty in Council, praying that a charter of incorporation may be granted to the said borough, Her Majesty was this day pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said petition be taken into consideration by a committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on Monday, the tenth day of March next.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board the humble Memorial of John Ayrton Paris, Esq. President of the Royal College of Physicians or Commonalty of the Faculty of Physic in London, setting forth that the said President and College have with great care, pains, and industry, revised, corrected, and reformed a book by them formerly published, inti-

tuled Pharmacopæia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Londinensis, prescribing and directing the manner of preparing all sorts of medicines therein contained, together with the true weights and measures by which they ought to be made, which book is now perfected and ready to be published, and it is conceived will contribute to the public good of Her Majesty's subjects, by preventing all deceits, differences, and uncertainties in making or com-pounding of medicines, if, for the future, the manner and form prescribed therein should be practised by apothecaries and others, in their composition of medicines; the memoralist therefore most humbly prays that Her Majesty will be graciously pleased to enforce the observance thereof in such manner as to Her Majesty shall seem meet: Her Majesty this day took the said memorial into Her royal consideration, and being desirous to provide in all cases for the common good of Her people, and being persuaded that the establishing the general use of the said book may tend to the prevention of such deceits in making and compounding medicines, wherein the lives and health of Her Majesty's subjects are so highly concerned, hath therefore thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, hereby to notify to all apothecaries and others concerned, to the intent they may not pretend ignorance thereof, that the said book, called Pharmacopæia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Londinensis, is per-fected and ready to be published; and Her Majesty doth therefore strictly require, charge, and command all and singular apothecaries and others, whose business it is to compound medicines or distil oils or waters, or make other extracts, within any part of Her Majesty's kingdom of Great Britain, called England, dominion of Wales, or town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, that they and every of them, immediately after the said Pharmacopœia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Loudinensis shall be printed and published, do not compound or make any medicine or medicinal receipt or prescription, or distil any oil or waters, or make other extracts that are or shall be in the said Pharmacopæia Collegii Regalis Medicorum Londinensis mentioned or named, in any other manner or form than is or shall be directed, preseribed, and set down by the said book, and according to the weights and measures that are or shall be therein limited, except it shall be by the special direction or prescription of some learned physician in that behalf; and Her Majesty doth hereby declare that the offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Her Majesty's just displeasure, but be proceeded against for such their contempt and offences according to the utmost severity of law.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the district parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, in the county of Surrey, and within the diocese of Winchester, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas, situate in Guildford-road, in the said district parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, under and by virtue of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more 'effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the 'building of additional churches in populous 'parishes,' as enlarged by the twelfth section of an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to amend and render 'more effectual the Church Building Acts,' or under or by virtue of any and every other power or authority in this behalf vested in your Majesty's said Commissioners by the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, South Kennington,' with boundaries as hereinafter mentioned:

"The boundary of the district chapelry of Saint Barnabas, South Kennington, commences at the point where the common sewer which separates the parish of Clapham from the parish of Lambeth meets in the middle of the road called Clapham-rise, and proceeds therefrom in a northeasterly direction along the middle of the Claphamroad as far as South Lambeth-road, it then proceeds in a northerly direction up the middle of South Lambeth-road as far as the lane called Cedars-lane, then north-westerly along the middle of that lane as far as Wheatsheaf-lane, and turning north-easterly proceeds up the middle of Wheatsheaf-lane so as to meet the point at which the street called New Wellington-street in the accompanying map, would, if produced, reach into the said Wheatsheaf-lane, and then proceeds in a north-westerly direction along the middle of the said street (called New Wellington-street), as far as the Wandsworth-road, down the middle of which road it proceeds in a south-westerly direction as far as the spring or well, and to the brook formed by the overflowing of such well, along which brook the boundary then proceeds north-westerly until it meets the common sewer which forms the boundary line separating the parish of Lambeth from the parishes of Battersea and Clapham, and following the line of boundary of the said parish of Lambeth in a south-westerly and southerly direction to the point where the boundary of such district chapelry commenced in the Clapham-road, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured blue :

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of new churches beg leave humbly to represent to

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned; and also the consent of the Reverend Charlton Lane, Master of Arts, incumbent of the said district parish of Saint Mark, Kennington, as required by the Act and section secondly hereinbefore mentioned, in order that the subdivision of such district parish, by forming thereout a district chapelry as aforesaid, shall take effect from the assignment of such district chapelry: in testimony whereof the said Charles Richard, Bishop of Winchester, and Charlton Lane have signed and sealed this representation:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment be accordingly made, and the recommendations of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, and the fees arising therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.
