*Before Sevastopol,
December 13, 1854.*

MY LORD DUKE,
IN my despatch of the 18th of October, reporting the opening of our fire upon the enemy's works, I omitted to mention the name of a highly meritorious Naval Officer, who had charge of a battery in the trenches, and rendered himself conspicuous by the manner in which he performed the important duty confided to him.

The officer I allude to is Captain Moorsom, whom I beg leave now to recommend to the notice of your Grace. I did not know until some time afterwards that he was employed in the trenches on the occasion in question; but having now been apprized of it, I avail myself of the present opportunity to rectify an error, which might otherwise be prejudicial to a most deserving officer.

THE College of Commerce makes known that, according to His Majesty's gracious letter of the 21st ultimo, a Submarine Telegraphic Cable has been put down in the Sound, south of the Island of Hoen, from Hillesborg, on the Swedish side, to Vedbeck, on the coast of Seeland; that, in order to point out the position of the line, the following small buoys have been put up, viz., two at Vedbeck, shewing the direction of the line from there to the S. of Hoen, being E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. and W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.; and two at Hillesborg, in the direction of the south point of Hoen, being E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. and W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.; also at the south end of Hoen, where the line forms an angle, is situated a larger buoy, smaller buoys with flags indicating the line at this part. This the Royal College has been graciously commanded hereby to proclaim, and to give notice that any one who injures the telegraph apparatus in any way is to be answerable for the same, as, in consequence thereof, no vessels or boats in the Sound are allowed to cast anchor in the above-mentioned direction.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Minister of Marine ad interim gives notice that in the Seagat of Goedereede, nearly in the middle of the navigable channel at the height between the second and third black buoys, a brig is sunk, the masts of which are above water, in the following bearings:

The steeple of Ouddorp, in the wooden mast beacon on the sand hills of Goedereede, the steeple of Goedereede bearing S.E. to S. and the stone beacon of Goedereede S. to W. by unadjusted compass; in 54 palms depth at low water. The needful measures have been taken, if at a later period the masts do not sufficiently indicate the spot, to place there a wreck buoy, bearing a flag.
